- 2. In the fall semester 2012 and Spring Semester 2013 I will teach three courses in which I would like to bring in guest speakers. In the Fall I expect to be teaching HIST/PSY 436 East Asian Warrior Cultures and PSY 344 Psychology and Traditional Asian Thought. The fall course is taught with the History program and is interdisciplinary. In the Spring I will be teaching PSY 473 Bizarre behaviors and Culture-Bound Syndromes. All of these courses are taught from a multicultural point of view. The invited speakers will help students reach the following educational objectives in Psychology
 - a. Students should have an understanding of applications of psychology to personal, social and organizational
 - b. Students should use and respect skeptical inquiry, critical thinking, and the scientific approach to understanding behavior
 - *c.* Students should have an understanding of the complexity of cultural diversity
 - d. Communication Skills: Students should understand themselves and others in a cultural context and develop interpersonal skills for dive... over the lifespan
 - e. Personal Development: Students should understand themselves and others in a cultural context and develop interpersonal skills for diversity over the lifespan
- 3. The guest speakers will also help realize the following outcomes related to our Mission Statement:

Identify and Describe the Modern World and Issues from Multiple Perspectives

4. **Relation to IRA to Course Offerings.** All IRAs must be integrally related to the formal instructional offerings of the University and must be associated with scheduled credit courses. Please list all classes that relate to the program proposed.

In the fall I will be teaching HIST-PSY 436 The History and Psychology of East Asian Warrior Cultures and PSY 344 Psychology and Traditional Asian Thought. For these courses I would like to bring in 7 speakers, Yoga expert Jessica Anderson, P. Scott Corbet who is an expert on the history of Mongolia, Jeet Kun Do expert Sifu Peter Nuygen, noted Karate masters Sensei Ben Otake and Hanshi John Sells, Iaido expert Sensei Jeff Learned, and Thai Boxing master Kru Ken Rose.

In the Spring I will be teaching PSY 473 Bizarre Behaviors and Culture Bound Syndrome. For this course I would like to bring in 2 guest speakers, Dr. Wendy Walsh noted author, television presenter and relationship expert, and Deborah Rubright who is a former police officer, counselor, and graduate of CI. These speakers will be lecturing on extreme relationships and criminality respectively, which are important components of the course.

HIST-PSY 436, PSY 344, and PSY 473 are very popular classes with the some of the largest enrollments on campus (approximately 125, 100, 90 respectively in 2012-13. Therefore, these speakers will impact a large number of students. I expect enrollments may go up next year.

Assessment of the guest speakers will take place via the traditional student course evaluations. The student's exam performance on topic present by the guest speakers will be another way to judge the effectiveness of the speakers.

By all accounts the speakers in these classes for the 2012-2013 academic year have been highly successful. Students report that the speakers made a huge impact on their studies and their lives. This is also evidenced by the number of students from outside my classes who ask me if specific speakers will return and if they can sign up for my courses. The speakers also support our mission statement by bringing an interdisciplinary and multicultural perspective to the campus.

PLEASE EXPLAIN (1) DESCRIPTION OF ACTIVITY; (2) HOW DID THE ACTIVITY RELATE TO A COURSE(S); AND (3) WHAT YOU LEARNED FROM THE PROCESS.

- 1. The activity was to have speakers for the HIST-PSY 436 East Warriors Culture, PSY 344 Traditional Asian Thought, and the PSY 473 Bizarre Behaviors and Culture Bound Syndromes courses. For the first two courses speakers came to campus and spoke/demonstrated about their martial arts or other Asian arts discipline. For the PSY 473 course guest speakers gave a lecture/discussion on their area of expertise.
- 2. The activities for the first two classes showed how traditional Asian arts are practiced and how they manifest in the modern world. For the PSY 473 course the speakers gave lecturers related to their areas of considerable expertise, giving students much deeper knowledge of the subjects than could be gleaned through reading.
- 3. We have been having these speakers come for a number of years now. This means we have narrowed down the very best guests to bring in. Therefore the demonstrations were highly successful. Since these are some of the largest enrolled courses on campus, many students were positively impacted by the speakers. Student feedback was unanimous in praise for the speakers.


