Brief Activity Description	<p>NOCHE DE FIESTA featuring: La Santa Cecilia</p> <p>For our tenth annual NOCHE DE FIESTA, The Spanish Program, with the support of the Chicano/a Studies Program, would like to bring award-winning La Santa Cecilia to perform on campus for our 10-year anniversary celebration. This widely popular Los Angeles band plays a unique vibrant blend of eclectic rhythms including cumbias, boleros, mariachi, jazz, blues, mariachi, rock and bossa nova. As first-generation children of Latino immigrants, La Santa Cecilia members have created a distinct variety of "tropical latin-pop" music that reflects their bilingual and bi-cultural Los Angeles upbringing.</p>

Learning Outcomes and Relation to IRA to Course Offerings	<p>The Spanish program asserts that this presentation would meet the Spanish program's student learning outcomes, which are: Demonstrate a reasonable understanding of the behavioral practices (patterns of social interactions), and the cultural products (for example, art, history, literature, music) of the Spanish-speaking world. To foster students' Spanish language acquisition in all four language skills (speaking, listening, reading, and writing).</p> <p>This activity directly addresses two of the fundamental pillars of the University Mission Statement by fostering international and multicultural awareness and understanding as we provide opportunities for CI students to be exposed to other countries' manifestations of popular culture through music.</p> <p>The following Spanish Program classes will integrate this function into its curriculum: Spanish 201 (Intermediate Spanish I), Spanish 202 (Intermediate Spanish II), Spanish 302 (Advanced Spanish, Part II) and Spanish 411 (Culture and Civilization of Latin America). All other Spanish courses will be encouraged to participate.</p> <p>The following Chicano/a Program classes will also integrate this function into its curriculum: CHS 331 Transborder Perspectives CHS 100 Chicano/as in Contemporary Society CHS 425 Contemporary Immigration Issues</p>
Description of Assessment Process	All students who attend this performance will receive an assessment questionnaire regarding the usefulness of the activity and how they have benefited from it. In addition, students in the Spanish program will write a personal review in which they have to demonstrate an understanding of the cultural topics manifested in the performance. These pieces can be used as assessment instruments to determine the attainment of educational goals.
