Brief Activity Description	Art instructors Christophe Bourély and Larry Lytle will take their painting and photography students for three days (two nights) at the CI Research Station on Santa Rosa Island. There, the students will draw, paint and photograph the island's landscape. More precisely, they will focus their attention on analyzing the impact human beings have had (and continue to have) on the island's natural environment. Their resulting imagery will be interpreted as straight documentation, pure artistic expression or both. The subsequent artworks will be exhibited to the general public at CSUCI's Palm Gallery.
Learning	This IRA is directly related to the regular requirements of upper division art classes. Indeed, this activity would concretize what is normally asked of

Outcomes and Relation to IRA to Course Offerings	advanced art students: one is the understanding and analysis of a particular topic and the second is the translation of that personal analysis into an esthetic visual language. In this particular case, the topic will be Santa Rosa Island and its Human Footprint; its resulting translation will be a series of original photographs and paintings that deal with this very topic. Learning outcomes for the students will be: An understanding of the human impact on Santa Rosa's landscape and ecology A personal investigation of this topic The creation of two-dimensional artistic works and accompanying written statements based on these analyses The mounting of an art exhibit at Cl's Palm Gallery that will display the created artworks to the general public An altogether greater engagement in the good stewardship of this island called Earth
Description of Assessment Process	Students will assess their activity at Santa Rosa Island in three separate ways: 1. In creating an artwork whose topic will be based on 'Santa Rosa Island and its Human Footprint' 2. In writing an artist statement on their personal approach 3. In verbalizing these thoughts during an exhibition to be held in fall 2015

Target Audience/Student Marketing	The intended audience for this event would be a selected group of students from the advanced painting and photography classes. It would be marketed as part of the class and included in the syllabus.
Bring Benefit to Campus	The benefit to the campus would come through an art exhibition at Cl's Palm Gallery. The month-long exhibit in fall 2015 will include a reception open to all students, faculty, staff and the general public. It will display photographs and paintings whose focus would be Santa Rosa Island and its Human Footprint. The goal of this exhibit would be to further advance Cl's research work at Santa Rosa Island as well as raise awareness toward a proactive stewardship of Earth's environment. Copies of the artworks (and some originals) will also be used to decorate the walls of the Cl Research Station at Santa Rosa.
Sustainability	The initial objective of this IRA is for students to investigate and subsequently visually respond to the impact humans have had on Santa Rosa Island. Yet, it is our hope that through this investigation a new higher goal will naturally ensue: the sensitizing of all participants to the sustainability, restoration and preservation of this fragile eco-system we all live in.
