Brief Activity Description	15 CI students will travel to Paris for two to study drawing, painting, art history and the French language at the Paris American Academy in Paris, France. The Paris American Academy will provide housing, classrooms, French language instruction and the use of its art studios. Language instruction will be taught by faculty of the Paris Academy. Art course instruction will be taught by CI Art Professor, Liz King. Field trips to museums, historical and cultural landmarks in and around Paris will also be a significant aspect of this course.
