### Description Endowed Chair of Chicana/o Studies at UCSB) conducted in-depth rich ethnographic research on young Chicana women to provide a voice for their femininity, sexuality, gender identity, ethnic/racial identity, and struggles. From this research, the book "Chicanas Speak Feminisms" emerged. Subsequently, Dr. Hurtado has written a new book, "Beyond Machismo: Chicana Intersectional Understandings of Latino Men's Feminisms." Both the Psychology and Chicana/a Studies programs would like to invite Dr. Aida Hurtado to CI to speak about her latest cutting edge research and exciting new book. Being a former student of Dr. Hurtado, she has had an important influence on my dissertation and research on Latina/o identity development. In addition, her work has had a tremendous impact infusing feminism and merging the fields of Psychology and Chicana/o Studies. This proposal requests funds to provide a stipend for the speaker and travel expenses. As a Hispanic Serving Institution (HSI), this event would support the University mission, providing both interdisciplinary and multicultural perspectives for student engagement.
