Brief Activity Description	THE ISLAND FOX is a professional quality literary review, the purpose of which is to present creative writing from students currently attending CSUCI as well as alumni, faculty, and community members. It showcases fiction, poetry, creative non-fiction, and drama. The program is linked specifically to the Creative Writing Emphasis, but will entertain submissions from any student or community member regardless of their major or whether they attend the university at this time. The literary journal will be circulated throughout the campus upon publication as well as through the community. At its core, the goal of the review is to invest in the talent and potential of CSUCI as well as increase interest in and support for the creative writing program. The journal is also intended to foster creativity and help contribute to the CSUCI identity by featuring our students' creative work. This year we are linking with the Poetry Slam project as well as some community based writing groups.
Learning Outcomes and Relation to IRA to Course Offerings	Students involved will 1)master the art of productive collaborative work 2)they will systematize the evaluation process 3)they will discuss all aspects of business management 4)they will discuss effective components of submitted stories and determine a criteria to judge literary merit for inclusion 5)they will articulate their literary values and goals for the publication in a letter to the readers 6)they will develop criteria to evaluate their own and peer contribution to the collective effort 7)they will meet deadlines, goals, payment to vendors and master responsible negotiation 8)they will create a handbook outlining how to run the business of publishing the journal for next year's group.
Description of Assessment Process	The journal itself – published well and on time, distributed, and shared with the community at the ISLAND FOX reading is the measure of our success. As such, we have submitted last year's journal along with this application. In addition, students do a peer review and self review based on specific criteria to evaluate the success of each student. However, the assessment process goes on weekly when each team reports out their progress with their assignment for the past week and the group evaluates its success in that way. Assessment is done, finally, with the grade each student receives based, again, on specific criteria listed on Blackboard.
