Brief Activity Description	This series of concerts/live demonstrations will bring some very special professional musicians to our CI campus to perform for the PAMU 330 Jazz in America class. The events will also be open for all other CI students to attend. Our musical guests will perform classic songs from the jazz music repertoire, and they will discuss the specifics of each composition and how this music relates to cultural and historical periods in American history. We have many statements from past students of this course expressing that they feel their level of understanding and appreciation of jazz music and its performance practices increase tremendously when they witness these live concerts that we bring to the classroom.
Learning Outcomes and Relation to IRA to Course Offerings	<p>Each concert will take place on the dates listed on the first page, during our regular class time. All PA students will be encouraged to attend our IRA concert events.</p> <p>PAMU 330 LEARNING OUTCOMES: Compare various styles of jazz from traditional jazz to contemporary jazz - Each performance will feature a variety of jazz music styles. Before the concert, significant class time is devoted to educating students about the history, styles, and customs of this music.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Analyze a jazz performance from the standpoints of improvisation, style, form, technique, and expression. Students are required to write about their impressions, observations, and analysis of the concerts. - Identify generally the style of jazz and its characteristics in a performance not previously encountered. Familiar and unfamiliar songs will be performed for our students, which they will then analyze, based on information that has been learned in class. <p>PAMU 109/ PAMU 309 OUTCOMES: Produce proper tone on their instrument or voice. Play assigned solo works stylistically correct, using proper tone, expression, and embellishments from all stylistic periods.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Observing professional musicians performing in person is an excellent educational experience for our students. Students will also be able to ask questions of the performers, which is an essential part of the learning process.

	PAMU 205 (Improvisation) and PAMU 308 (Ensemble): The students in these performing ensembles will benefit directly from witnessing our great guest musicians performing the techniques that have been taught in these classes.
Description of Assessment Process	Students in my courses will be required to complete an online Qualtrics survey about the event, and they will also be required to write a detailed paper about what they observed and learned during the performance experience. The latter activity is part of our "Writing Across the Curriculum" campaign. The results of the post-concert Qualtrics survey will be attached to my IRA Report about these events.
