<b>Brief Activity</b>	Two Guest Speakers from the community will be asked to present on a Health in Society related topic.

<b>Description</b>	<p><b>SPEAKER ONE</b> Katherine Kasir is the Executive Director for Straight Up! Ventura County and is an expert in the field of substance abuse prevention. She is the current (May 2015) recipient of the prestigious Community Partner Award for Outstanding Partnership, from the Center for Community Engagement (CCE), from CSU, Channel Islands. She works tirelessly to engage youth 12-25 to peer teach about the dangers of substance abuse and works to educate parents about the perils of underage drinking in homes. Katherine has been an unpaid Guest Lecturer in COMM/NRS 441 and COMM 325, and has offered countless Service Learning hours to students in various Programs at CSU, Channel Islands, all over the last five years.</p> <p>Straight Up is a Ventura County-based youth development project for ages 12-25 that promotes social change regarding underage and binge drinking, impaired driving, marijuana, prescription and over-the-counter drugs, HIV/AIDS prevention, and other concerns using improvisation and interactive techniques to engage discussion, explore issues, and develop personal and community solutions to these issues.</p> <p>Katherine's Presentation Topic (2.5 Hours) will be "Finding Health and Psychological Well-Being". In addition to sharing content, Katherine offers interactive, educational games and experiential activities.</p> <p><b>SPEAKER TWO</b> Danielle Anderson is the Executive Director for the Independent Living Resource Center (ILRC) in Ventura, Santa Barbara, and San Luis Obispo counties. The Independent Living (IL) philosophy is one of full access, equal opportunity, and maximum success and self-sufficiency for all people with disabilities. In 2013, Danielle was selected as one of 50 Notable People in the Disability Community and currently serves as Vice Chair on the California State Rehabilitation Council (SRC) in Sacramento. Danielle has been a frequent, unpaid Guest Lecturer in various courses at CSU, Channel Islands for three years.</p> <p>The ILRC helps people with disabilities on referrals for accessible housing, transportation, or education; seeking assistive technology or assistance with the processes around benefit programs such as SSI, SSDI, Medi-Cal, and work incentives programs; or looking for an advocate. Additionally, the ILRC advocates for disability rights, with a focus on accessibility and removing barriers, as well as creating opportunities to achieve equality for individuals with disabilities.</p> <p>Danielle's Presentation Topic (2.5 hours) will be "Disabilities and the Perception of 'Health' ". Both events will be open to all students.</p>
<b>Learning Outcomes and Relation to IRA to Course Offerings</b>	<p>These two all-campus events are related to general course offerings in various programs, such as Communication (in particular, the COMM/NRS 441 - Health Communication course), as well as courses in the Nursing Program.</p> <p>The classroom presentations will be offered in multiple sessions within the COMM 495 - Health Film and Speaker Series course, which serves our 400 COMM majors. In addition, COMM 495 course is a course that offers a single unit, sometimes a critical need for our transfer students, in all programs, who are pending graduation. Therefore, this content could reach students in all majors, depending upon student enrollment mix and student need for Spring 2016, especially graduating seniors who are shy one unit.</p> <p>There are two Student Learning Objectives, both of which are clearly addressed by the content of the two presentations:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Identify current critical health issues; and,</li> <li>2. Draw correlations between current issues introduced in films/documentaries and by guest speakers to concepts and theories discussed in other Communication and Health Sciences courses.</li> </ol>
<b>Description of Assessment Process</b>	<p>Students attending the all-campus event will be asked to fill out a survey evaluating both of the speakers' presentations.</p> <p>In addition, the enrolled students of the COMM 495 - Health Film and Speaker Series course will be asked to write a short assessment of how the content from both of these lectures relates to previous class material covered.</p>
