In addition, students will listen to poetry from Colombia in both Spanish and English, and get to be exposed to the writing of Gabriel Garcia Marquez (Nobel Prize) through a skit. It will be a cultural night in which students not only will have fun, but get a real taste of the Colombian culture.
