Brief Activity Description	We seek support to bring three invited speakers to campus for a new interdisciplinary course that will explore the sociocultural importance of sandy beaches in Southern California, examine anthropogenic stressors on the ecosystem, and explore the interaction of natural and human systems. This course will introduce students to the physical and biological aspects of California's beach ecosystem and provide many different perspectives on California's beach culture and society. Given the breadth of topics addressed in the course, students would benefit greatly from the additional expertise provided by external specialists with particular knowledge of the environmental and socio-cultural characteristics of the region. In addition, we would like to incorporate a field trip to Surfer's Point to discuss the managed retreat beach restoration project and the cultural, recreational, geomorphological, and management implication of the project.
Learning Outcomes and Relation to IRA to Course Offerings	1. ESRM335 The Beach 2. Invited speakers throughout the Spring 2017 semester will address a number of topics and concerns, all of which reinforce general program learning outcomes: Understanding the historical context of the unique cultural development of the southern California coastal region. Articulating the interdisciplinary nature of environmental issues in an increasingly urban coastline. The field trip to Surfer's Point will allow students to observe real-world novel solutions to existing resource management challenges.
Description of Assessment Process	Students will interpret current environmental issues in the coastal zone through writing reflections, journaling experiences, blog posts, and preparing, revising and submitting written public comment on issues pertaining to coastal development and sustainability (for example: Environmental Impact Statements/Reports, environmental legislation, agency regulations or letters to the editor).

We plan to arrange a larger venue, to publicize the visiting speaker events across the campus, and anticipate interest and attendance by ESRM students and the broader campus community.

Sustainability	A primary focus of this course is to understand the historical development context of southern California and to explore how increasing conflicts in resource demands require novel solutions that promote long term sustainability. We anticipate that visiting speakers will provide this context and discuss case studies where sustainable resource use has been promoted through the use of emerging multi-use management solutions.
