Our guest artists will perform classical music repertoire for our two sections of the PANU 337 "Music in History" course, our Music Theory classes, and various other Performing Arts courses. Other CI students, faculty, staff, and community members are also totally welcome to attend these special concerts. Our fantastic guest artists will demonstrate and discuss significant musical compositions by some of the greatest composers of all time: Brief Activity Description J.S. Bach, Beethoven, Mozart, Brahms, Claude Debussy, as well as contemporary composers. The Baroque, Classical, Romantic, Impressionist, and Modern musical style periods will be represented, giving students a rare up-close view of these masterworks being performed right before their very eyes. The musical selections that are presented by our guest artists correspond directly with the musical style periods and legendary composers that we study in our PAMU 337 course. One concert for this course related performance series involves bringing in a very high-level professional concert planist to our campus to perform One concent of the Course related performance series involves orminging in a very high-rever processional concert plants to our campus to periority and demonstrate piano literature from the Baroque, Classical, Romantic, and Impressionist style periods. In past semesters, I have presented the internationally recognized concert plantst Dr. Junie Cho, who is a piano professor at Appalachian State University's renowned Hayes School of Music in North Carolina. Dr. Cho is a stunningly amazing plantist, and her program and lecture components were well loved by our students. On other occasions, I have presented Mr. Gary Nesteruk, who has performed piano and keyboards on over 100 Helywood movie scores. Gary is a pianist who excels equally at classical, jazz, and popular music. His appearances at Cl consist of his performances of diverse piano compositions, and Gary also shows the students video excerpts of his work in Hollywood recording studios, and the students learn about how music is recorded for TV and Our other guest performances will be byprofessional ensembles, such as the Singer Chamber Players. The Singer Chamber Players are led by clarinetist David Singer. Mr. Singer was a long time member of the multiple Grammy Award winning Orpheus Chamber Orchestra (NYC). The Singer Players performed at Cl in the Spring and Fall of 2016, and their presentation was verywell received by our students. Our musical guests do an outstanding job of verbally introducing each composition and providing a historical and stylistic context for each musical offering. There will be time allotted for our students to ask questions of our visiting artists. Past students have overwhelmingly voiced support for these live concert events, and have stated that these concerts are very helpful for them to gain a full understanding of the musical concepts that are presented in this course.
