Brief Activity Description	<p>This rapidly-evolving era of new federal policy towards immigrants and immigration has all the hallmarks of a profound shift in American attitudes towards folks born outside of the United States. While the potential impact upon our society and culture are likely to be profound, the form of that impact may manifest in unforeseen and unpredicted ways. One potential impact may well be a changed attitude towards public spaces by undocumented peoples or other recent immigrants. We may well begin to see greater trepidation about visiting/utilizing public open spaces such as beaches, National Parks, and local reserves.</p> <p>We propose to explore attitudes towards and behavior within open spaces via anonymous survey of the general public in both Spanish and English. We will build off of the on-going annual CSUCI Survey of Coastal Opinions and Behaviors conducted each fall by students in ESRM462: Coastal and Marine Management, conducting both face-to-face surveys in Santa Barbara, Ventura, and Los Angeles Counties and conducting a national, online poll.</p> <p>Students in various courses will participate by collecting and exploring this aggregate dataset in the Fall of 2017, culminating in a seminar at CI open to the entire campus community in December or 2017 wherein students will present their results.</p> <p>If successful, this could roll into a longer-term exploration of access by different segments of our greater community.</p>
Learning Outcomes and Relation to IRA to Course Offerings	ESRM 462-Coastal and Marine Management: students will conduct face-to-face surveys/analyze data ESRM 335-The Beach: students will conduct face-to-face surveys ESRM 328-Introduction to GIS; students will generate maps of access "hot spots"
Description of Assessment Process	Students in participating classes will be assessed at the end of the semester, no formal assessment of the culminating seminar will be conducted, but informal assessment of participants will be collected and reported in our final report.
