#### **Brief Activity Description**

The guest lecturer, Ms. Claudia Boyd-Barrett, has been a journalist for the past 14 years. She holds an M.A. in journalism from Universidad de San Andres and Grupo Clarin in Argentina, and a B.A. in Combined Studies in Spanish and Social Sciences from Manchester University in the United Kingdom. She is a 2017 California Data Fellow with the Center for Health Journalism at USC, 2015 USC Annenberg California Health Journalism fellow, 2006 Inter American Press Association fellow, and winner of the 2011 Associated Press Society of Ohio Best Investigative Reporting award.

Ms. Boyd-Barrett is a regular contributor to the California Health Report, Ventura County Star, Center for Health Reporting at the University of Southern California, and BabyCenter.com. The focus of her reporting is on healthcare in California, especially as it relates to seniors, children, and disadvantaged communities.

During the guest lecture, Ms. Boyd-Barrett will speak about some of the healthcare stories she is currently working on (e.g. mental health issues among college students in Southern California; the critical influence of government programs, such as Med-Cal and Medicare, on the healthcare system in California). She will also talk and answer questions about working as a journalist in general and share how to find interesting stories. Students from various disciplines, including but not limited to Communication, English, Health Science, Psychology and Political Science, might find her talk especially relevant to their academic and professional interests.

#### Learning Outcomes and Relation of IRA to Course Offerings

This all-campus lecture relates to wide variety of programs, including but not limited to Communication, English, Health Science, Psychology and Political Science. The overarching goal is to introduce students to the field of health journalism and to potential career opportunities in this area, as well as to provide students with a better understanding of contemporary healthcare issues in California. Students from the following courses will especially benefit from this guest lecture, given its connection with the course learning outcomes:

COMM/NRS 441 Health Communication: This course is designed to provide an overview of key perspectives, theories, concepts and current issues related to health communication at multiple levels, including intrapersonal, interpersonal, mediated, community and policy levels. By speaking about some of the most recent assignments she has been working on, Ms. Boyd-Barrett will enable students to see how issues relevant to social, cultural, political, contemporary/ historical, economic, educational, or psychological realities interact with one other to shape health outcomes in California, which constitutes a key learning outcome of COMM/NRS 441. In addition, Ms. Boyd-Barrett will share her professional experience and advice with students who are interested in career opportunities in journalism, especially healthcare reporting.
 COMM 325 Health Media Campaigns: This course is designed to teach how to increase awareness and change behaviors through understanding the process of researching, planning, implementing and evaluating communication campaigns in the health context. Health campaign developers and health journalists use many similar techniques in researching issues of interest so students can learn from Ms. Boyd-Barrett's experience in investigative health reporting and apply this knowledge to campaign design.

#### **Description of Assessment Process**

Attendees to the campus-wide lecture will be asked to fill out a questionnaire to provide feedback on the event and their key takeaways. Students in the COMM/NRS 441 Health Communication will also write a reflection essay to connect what they learned from Ms. Boyd-Barrett's talk with the course's learning outcomes and required readings. Furthermore, students from COMM325 will be asked to write a reflection paper if they choose to attend this lecture for extra credit.
