## 2. Brief Activity Description

#### **Brief Activity Description**

This first-ever CI student songwriting competition and Performing Arts (PA) student recording is a landmark event for CI. We have secured four-time GRAMMY award winner and legendary Beatles engineer, Geoff Emerick to be involved in the competition and recording project from its inception to its finish. This project came about as a result of last years first-ever PA Student recording and CD. This recording was done as a favor from Mr. Emerick on a shoestring budget of leftover money from several Performing Arts IRA proposals which was approved by the IRA chair. Although we did complete the recording we realized that trying to record at an insufficient studio and getting discounted "favors" from Music Industry professionals in Los Angeles was not the way to go. Another issue that came up is that one of the groups, the PAMU 310 Contemporary Music Ensemble that I direct recorded covers of famous songs. This became problematic when we tried to get licensing on the copy-written material. The result is that we were able to record CD's that we can give out as "gifts", but we cannot put any of the material onto musical distribution sites like itunes, spotify and youtube. Because of this, we decided that this time we would feature original songs written by our very own CI students which would enable us to put on over 25 musical distribution websites. The process of this project is: In October 2017 a call will go out to students campus-wide to submit an original song for the competition. I and other PA colleagues will narrow down the submissions to 10-15 songs. On Thur. Nov. 30th, Geoff Emerick, Emmy award nominated Television composer of two and a Half Men and Mike and Molly, Grant Geissman, CI President Dr. Ericka Beck and myself, will judge the competition and select four to five songs. These lucky winners will then have their songs arranged for the PAMU 310 ensemble (which includes a full horn section and backup vocalists), they will be rehearsed throughout the spring semester and recorded at the end of the spring semester. The recording will take place at LAFX, a professional recording studio in Los Angeles which includes some of the best vintage equipment in LA, including a \$150, 000 analog API soundboard for recording. The songs will then be recorded and mixed over several days, and then mastered at Golden Mastering in Ventura. Artwork will be done by CI Art students and then all material will be submitted to the disc maker website and later released on over 25 musical distribution websites. This project is a full academic year of planning. Mr. Emerick has agreed to help me oversee the entire recording project which will feature several other student-based ensembles and students who are studying privately. We plan to have recordings of the PAMU 490 Steel Drum ensemble, the PAMU 204 African Drumming, the PAMU 307 University Chorus and several other smaller advanced groups comprised of Performing Art and CI students who are studying in PAMU 109/309 Private Lessons with one of our PA faculty. So, Mr. Emerick will be in charge of having all these various groups recorded, mixed and mastered for the recording project. We are incredibly lucky to have our CI students to get a chance to work with a legend in the Music Business in Mr. Emerick.
