Brief Activity Description	I am planning to record our newest performing ensemble on campus, the "African Drumming Ensemble". The purpose for this recording is to document the pieces of music that we have been learning throughout the semester. This recording will be done by the students in a professional studio in order to accurately capture this unique sound. We will use this recording for analysis during the semester so as to refresh our knowledge and understanding of all the parts to the ensemble. Furthermore, we want to distribute this recording to people at our performances to help with raising the profile of the class and the school. It will also be used as a recruitment tool for potential incoming students. Students over the past 2 semesters have expressed an interest in having some sort of documentation of the music that they have learned. This project would then serve all students including past members, current members and future members.		
Learning Outcomes and Relation to IRA to Course Offerings	PAMU 204 Learning Outcomes: Compare various musics from the African Diaspora. Each track on the recording will feature a different piece of music. Each piece will be analyzed for its content and its cultural significance. Analyze the performance from the standpoints of improvisation, style, form, technique, and expression. Students will then discuss the similarities and differences between the styles. Students will will hear all the parts that make up the ensemble. The recording will be layered in an effort to isolate each individual part as well as the whole ensemble playing together. PAMU 109! PAMU 309: Produce proper tone and technique on their instrument. Listening to a full drumming ensemble, is an excellent educational experience for our students. Work on specific parts for the ensemble. Using the recording as a reference, students can hear the desired result of the parts of the music to work during private lessons. PAMU 205 (Improvisation) and PAMU 332: The students in these classes will benefit by listening and analyzing specific music pieces from various countries. The recordings will include various examples of improvisational forms in African music. They can be used to support in class discussion and readings of African music and culture.		
Description of Assessment Process	Students in my courses will be required to complete an online Qualtrics survey about the project, and they will also be required to write a paper about they observed and learned during the recording experience. We will then have an open discussion forum to discuss the process and have a learned of the music. The student feedback that I gather will be attached to my IRA event report.
