Brief Activity Description

This is an IRArequest for the ART/PAMU231 The Beatles: Music, Fashion and Culture course. I have established a friendship with legendaryformer Beatles engineer, Geoff Emerick and have been bringing Mr. Emerick to visit to interact in and outside our classes with our students for the last five

years. Mr. Emerickwas the senior recording engineer with the Beatles from 1966-1970 recording what manymusic historians consider the greatest

albums in Popular music history, these include 1966-Revolver, 1967-Sgt. Pepper's LonelyHearts Club Band, 1968-The White Album and 1969 AbbeyRoad.Geoff has also received fourGRAMMYawards. The students often remark that this is the highlight of the class.

Mr. Emerickwill be visiting or having students visit from several other classes as well. The PAMU200 HistoryofRock class are required to attend. Mr. Emerickwill also visit the PAMU307 ContemporaryMusic Ensemble as thewywill be perfroming their Midterm performance exam for him and the PAMU385 Audio Design and Recording class where he will critique students recorded works. All there courses greatlybenefit from Mr. Emerick's

expertise and this allows Mr. Emerick's contact and impact on CI students to go well beyond the PAMU231 Beatles course and have a direct impact on many more CI students from several other classes.
