Brief Activity Description

The Performing Arts Dance Emphasis would like to take its upper division students to the American College Dance Association's(ACDA) Baja/Southwest Regional Conference in 2019. Participation in ACDA will further demonstrate the broad range of current dance scholarship and diversity in the dance community. Students will have an opportunity to showcase their creative activities to a distinct panel of judges and view other works. ACDA is the only national organization to support the performance and choreography based creative activities of both student and faculty dance scholars. Students would be exposed to graduate programs in dance and CI's Dance Emphasis would receive recognition for its creative contributions to the academic field of dance scholarship.

A paper regarding on the experience for those students participating will be required to help critically assess and reflect on the artistic, intellectual, and educational facets of the conference.
