Brief Activity Description

The English Program offers a year-long course called "The Publishing House." During the fall semester, students learn about book publishing (its history, significance, cultural issues). We also select a manuscript for publication. This manuscript was submitted to Los Angeles publisher Gorsky Press. Gorsky is a 501(c)3 not-for-profit book publisher. After we select the manuscript for Gorsky to publish, we spend the second semester ushering the book to publication. We learn everything from editing to cover design to book marketing. We prepare the book for the printer, and have the book printed. At the end of the semester, we hold a book release party.

To be clear, while this book is created in a class, it's much more than a class project. We've already selected the manuscript. It will be acclaimed poet James Jay's third collection of poetry. Gorsky will ensure national distribution, reviews in trades, and all the other things a traditional publishing house does. We'll team up with them to make the book a reality.

With the exception of the book release, this money will be used primarily for English 490: The Publishing House. The book release party will be open to both the campus community and the general public. Because CI students will pay for some of the printing, we'll make a certain number of free copies available to the students.

This is a unique course among CI's offerings. For decades, English studies have been criticized for not being practical and for not leading to jobs. This course gives students experience working in publishing and working with a publisher. It's a course that has been promoted at various events by the university president. It's a course that English majors look forward to. It's one way we can show English majors that there are several options for them to pursue with their degree.
