2. Brief Activity Description

Brief Activity Description

SPED/SS 560: Access to Learning is a co-taught course which allows students earning special education and single subject teaching credentials an opportunity to take a course together, taught by two professors (one professor from special education and one from single subject education). This course provides a unique opportunity for the school of education to provide training and share experiences to students representing both fields of education. The goals of the course are broad and include topics related to providing access to learning to students with disabilities and other learning needs. In addition to lecture and in class activities, we plan to bring in speakers to discuss, among other topics: suicide prevention and warning signs training for teachers, innovations and implementation of technology in education, co-teaching experiences from the field, and supports for students who are in foster care, children of migrant farm workers and the juvenile justice system. All of the topics addressed by speakers allow first hand testimony about what it is like to work with and support students of various at-risk populations which will provide guidance for our students (future teachers) as they embark on their careers in education.

SPED 541: Foundations of Special Education is a course which is required for all education specialist credential candidates and is only offered in the Fall. Speakers in this course would include parents speakers who address their experiences in interacting with the special education system over the years on behalf of their children as they advocate for this child's needs during the school age years. One of the goals of this class is to discuss the parent role in the special education process and to gain perspective of the parent and family as they navigate special education programs for and with their children. Additionally, speakers from Ventura County Office of Education who work on the technological side of creating Individual Education Plans (IEPs) will come to talk about and help train credential candidates on the SIRAS which is the platform used on Ventura County. One of the main goals of this course it to teach candidates how to write IEPs so they are prepared to enter schools with a teaching credential.

Learning Outcomes and Relation of IRA to Course Offerings

SPED 541 is a semester long course which meets for three hours per week. One week focuses on parental experience and advocacy. The speaker will prepare a talk for the students detailing their experiences (e.g. diagnoses, IEP meeting and teacher interactions). Time will be allotted for a question and answer session. VCOE partners will come in during the initial training of teachers on the SIRAS system. Each speaker is expected to speak for 1-2 hours during the relevant class sessions.

SPED/SS 560 is an eight week class (September- November) which meets for four hours per week. Each week, we address a different topic as it relates to providing access to student learning, specifically for students in marginalized populations. We aim to have eight speakers over the course of the semester speaking on various topics (noted above) to supplement course readings, lecture and activities. Each speaker is expected to speak for one hour, with the exception of the suicide prevention/awareness speaker who will speak for two hours.

Dates for speakers have not been determined at this time.

Description of Assessment Process

Part of the course requirements for each of the two courses include regular reflection writings on the topics discussed including an evaluation of the speaker(s) as it relates to their current teaching placement and projected need as a credentialed teacher. Reflections are evaluated as part of their overall course grade and considered part of regular course participation. They additionally serve as an evaluation tool of speaker effectiveness.

Those speakers include the suicide prevention/training speaker, the speaker who discusses the educational experiences of foster youth, migrant youth and other special populations in Ventura County and the parent advocate. These three speakers' topics are of importance to the campus community.
