2. Brief Activity Description

Brief Activity Description

Guatemalan-American poet Maya Chinchilla and Salvadoran-American poet Karina Oliva Alvarado (whose poetry is featured in The Wandering Song: Central American Writing in the US) will be coming to give a poetry reading and public lecture to CSUCI with the goal of teaching students about the diverse realities of Central American-American experience in the US and abroad. The educational objective is to help students counter the stereotypical narratives told about Central Americans through the US media (gang violence, drug cartels, civil wars, and even President Trump calling El Salvador "a shithole country"). Overall, Americans know very little about Central America (it is a footnote in world history) or of the diaspora (the dispersal of its people throughout the world, fleeing as war refugees in the 1980s-90s). Even Mexican-American students at CSUCI know very little about Central Americans except the negative stereotypes Mexicans may have of Central Americans. Overall, it is a much-needed learning experience from which the whole campus can benefit.

Bay-area Guatemalan-American poet, Maya Chinchilla, author of "The Cha Cha Files: A Chapina Poética" makes visible the Central American-Guatemalan diaspora and disentangles the myths from the mayhem of civil wars, urban wars, and as she calls, it, "the wars raging in young hearts." "The Cha Cha Files" honors Central American feministas, Long Beach roqueras, families divided by war, lovers separated by borders, and celebrates the pleasure and heartbreak of queer love amongst children of immigrants in southern and northern California. Karina Oliva Alvarado is local poet and lecturer at UCLA whose most recent book is US Central Americans: Reconstructing Memories, Struggles, and Communities of Resistance.

Chinchilla and Oliva Alvarado's poetry reading will enable students to learn about race, immigration, gender and sexuality, class, citizenship status, and how these intersectional identities affect our lived experience in the world. Students who major in Chicana/o Studies will acquire knowledge of the history and culture of people of Latin American origins. This activity will give students an opportunity to analyze the literary, performative, and visual expressions of Latinas/os in the US. They will be able to distinguish variations within Chicana/o communities in respect to class, culture, ethnicity, gender, race, and sexuality.

English major students will be an afforded an opportunity to engage a range of texts, representative of multiple genres, periods, ethnicities and genders. They will examine texts, issues, or problems in the discipline from multiple perspectives (multicultural, interdisciplinary, international, experiential, theoretical and/or educational). They will critically interpret and analyze original texts (written, visual, and electronic) and

effectively use and critically evaluate current scholarship in the field (literary analysis, linguistics studies, applied research, etc.). This interdisciplinary perspective will also help them acquire an understanding of how the field of English relates/can relate to other disciplines.
