Wilderness First Aid, Santa Rosa, Fall 2021

Brief Activity Description

As part of ESRM 301-01 (Field Professionalism), Professor Kuo intends to take the entire class to Santa Rosa Island, for hands-on training in a realistic environment. The class, which covers Wilderness First Aid, Emergency Communications, and other skills that are very helpful for our students in field work and in the environments they are likely to be working or studying environmental science and resource management, is best taught in an outdoors environment where students can learn skills in situations similar to where they might actually be called upon to use those skills in the real world. Unlike a classroom, the environment on Santa Rosa Island is essentially the same outdoors, remote environment where our students would be expected to apply the knowledge they are learning in the class, and offers up many challenges that they would not encounter in a classroom setting. Examples of that are: remoteness from civilization; no access to phone service; lack of typical resources found in an urban or suburban environment.

The group will participate in hands-on activities, exercises, training, and more in a variety of island environments, which will enhance the realism of the course and help them better retain and apply the skills they will be covering. In addition, by conducting the training in the actual wilderness, they will gain a better understanding of the challenges they likely will face in their professional and academic life in the field.

In addition to the unique advantages of conducting this classroom work in a remote environment which is so relevant to the course material, as we return from a stressful pandemic year, it offers students the opportunity to reconnect with their peers, develop social relationships which have been so sorely lacking with remote classwork, and help students disconnect from the 24/7/365 online Zoom - Internet - social media world.

Learning Outcomes & Relation to Course Offering

This IRA is directly related to the purpose of ESRM 301 – Field Professionalism, which is training in a wide variety of ancillary field skills necessary to safely and professionally work as a field scientist. Skills include basic first aid, wilderness first aid, communication (via cell, satellite, and radio), site assessment, basic camping and survival skills, basic orienteering, personal safety, and related competencies necessary to fieldwork. This activity would significantly enhance what is normally taught in a classroom environment, by forcing students to learn those skills in the actual wilderness and in a remote area.

Learning outcomes for the students will be:

> Students will learn how to manage common injuries and illnesses when medical care is an hour away or more.

> Due to the unique experience of learning on Santa Rosa, in a wilderness environment, the impact of that training will be enhanced.

> Professional certification for Wilderness First Aid (WFA) from a fully recognized third party (ECSI)
