Brief Activity Description

This funding request is to support augmented activities in our ESRM 462: Coastal Management course.

This would support an in-person field experience (a 3 day camping trip to visit various sites/themes we are discussing in our class) and a virtual conference (BlueTech Week; https://www.tmabluetech.org/bluetech-week) with entrepreneurs who are developing new technologies to respond to coastal management challenges across the globe.

This would support:

- 1) trour fees (camping/day use fees) for a three day trip up the central coast (total costs \$250)
- 2) bulk registration for 30 seats for the week-long virtual BlueTech Week Conference (at \$50 per seat, total cost \$1,500)

BlueTech Week Conference

Students from ESRM 462 (Coastal and Marine Management) will participate in a 5-day virtul ocean summit as part of an optional class field experience. We have previously attended this event in 2018. This year, the organizers are again inviting university students to participate in a particular track: the Ocean STEM/Workforce Development track. Our students would both attend and present work from my lab (our AARR apprenticeship program) as well as longitudinal research they and previous ESRM 462 students have been conducting each September since 2006 exploring the perceptions of coastal management and the behaviors of coastal zone residents. Knowing of Cl's work with STEM engagement, Michael B. Jones, President of The Maritime Alliance & TMA Foundation and organizer of the summit, has extended an invitation to CI students after speaking to our class in 2016, 2017, & 2018.

This is a unique opportunity for our undergrads to meet with ocean thought leaders and tech start-ups working across the coastal zone. It would be quite valuable for students to both engage with other coastal professionals and showcase their emerging skill sets outside of the context of a traditional academic conference.
