### Brief Activity Description

I am proposing to take a group of students out to the Santa Rosa island Research Station on one or two different trips. The number of trips depends on COVID protocols and station availability and capacity. Students from the Art program, upper division and lower will take part in various creative activities on Santa Rosa Island both in and around the CSUCI Research Station. These activities will explore the intersection of art and science, delving on to the various research projects that take place around Bechers Bay, most notably the Marine Debris project. Students will be exposed to the basics of scientific fieldwork, as well as the creative inspiration of the outdoors has classically had on artists (photography, plain air painting, environment art ect.). The hope is that the outcome of the trip can coincide with the CIS (Channel Islands Symposium) in whatever form it takes (Virtual or live or a hybrid). Due to the timing of funding cycles, I am not sure what exactly CIS will be doing in the fall.

### **Learning Outcomes & Relation to Course Offering**

This IRA is directly related to the regular requirements of upper division art classes in all aspects. This activity would concretize what is normally asked of advanced art students: one is the understanding and analysis of a particular topic and the second is the translation of that personal analysis into an esthetic visual language. In this particular case, the topic will be Santa Rosa Island, Channel Islands National Park, the science and human activity that takes place there and its resulting translation will be a series of original artworks that deal with this very topic.

Learning outcomes for the students will be:

- An understanding of the human impact on Santa Rosa's landscape and ecology, and its inherent beauty
- A personal investigation of this topic
- The creation of three-dimensional or other artistic works and accompanying written statements based on these analyses
- A basic understanding of the technical aspect of creating and developing conceptual foundations while working in the field and collecting data (if you will) for future works of art, focusing on material, form and location metaphor
- The inclusion of this art work in student exhibitions Virtual or otherwise at CI galleries that will display the created artworks to the general public, as well as possible exhibitions at offsite locations in the greater regional community. Once again, the hope is to work with the Channel Islands Symposium happening in the FALL of 2021
- An altogether greater engagement in the good stewardship of the environment
