PAMU 337 Music in History Guest Performance and Lecture Series

Brief Activity Description

I am planning a series of virtual (Fall 2021) and in-class (Spring 2022) concerts and guest lectures that will bring in high-level multi-genre professional musicians and speakers from within and out of the regional area of CI campus. Our guest artists will perform recitals and give mini-lectures for the PAMU 337 Music in History course. Such opportunity will also benefit our Music Theory classes, and other Performing Arts courses. Other CI students, faculty, staff, and community members will also be invited to attend either virtually or in-person these special concerts and lectures. The musical selections that will be performed will range from the Middle Ages to the Contemporary era. Musical genres and styles will include the art music, musical theater, and jazz. Performance groups include solo artist and chamber ensembles. These live performances will give students a rare up-close view of these masterworks performed; the students will also have the opportunity to speak to our guest artists and ask them questions during these sessions. The musical selections that our guest artists present will correspond directly with the musical style periods and composers that we study in our PAMU 337 course.

Concert and Lecture Series No. 1 will invite world-renowned classical guitarist <u>Even Taucher</u> (Austin, Texas) and his accompanist to produce an educational and performance in virtual format. Evan Taucher has enjoyed performing concerts across the United States and Europe, most recently performing and teaching in the 2019 at GuitarSarasota's Concert Series, Grand Rapids International Artist Series, Madison Classical Guitar Series, the famous Palacio del Portalet in Alicante, Spain as well as in Valencia, Spain at the Florida State University campus. Most recently, he was chosen among all North American applicants as the 2019 Magellan Scholar to study in Spain with the classical guitar's foremost luminaries. During his two years of study with Cuban virtuoso Rene Izquierdo, Taucher won 8 separate prizes in professional competitions throughout the United States including 3 Grand Prizes.

Concert and Lecture Series No. 2 will invite the Singer Chamber Players led by Grammy Award winning clarinetist David Singer. Mr. Singer was a long time member of the multiple Grammy Award winning <u>Orpheus Chamber Orchestra</u> (NYC). He has performed in various world-class concert halls, in the White House, appeared in movies and has recorded with the renowned recording label "Naxos". The Singer Players will perform a concert of music from the classical genre and will be talking to our students about styles of music and lives of musicians.

Concert and lecture series No. 3 will invite Southern California based composer-instrumentalist <u>Ashley Hoyer</u> and her ensemble, The Syncopaths. Ms. Hoyer discovered the mandolin at age eight, then took up the cello in college. Described as a "mandolin phenomenon" by the San Diego Tribune and highly sought after by a wide range of musicians needing to round out their sound, Broder has performed in folk clubs, festivals, bars, dance halls, orchestras, and recording studios. Her duo with accordionist Samantha Harvey, Sam 'n Ash, was featured on the wildly popular podcast "Welcome to Night Vale," and Hearth Music raved that The Syncopaths, an indemand, nationally touring, folk quartet with whom she plays regularly, are "a helluva a band to imitate, and I doubt anyone could do justice to their virtuosic tunes." Most recently, she's been collaborating with violinist, Edwin Huizinga, and guitarist, William Coulter, fusing Bach with traditional and contemporary folk tunes. The trio premiered their "Partita Americana" at the 2018 Carmel Bach Festival.

Our musical guests do an outstanding job of verbally introducing their programs and providing a historical and stylistic context for each of their musical offerings. The Q & A at each session between our students and our visiting artists will be very valuable to our students' learning experience.

PAMU 337 Learning Outcomes:

Our students will be able to show, through writing, discussion and oral presentation, an understanding of the course content and convey the key points of this course to an audience of their peers. - Students will be required to write a detailed report about the concert/demonstrations, highlighting their observations and informed analysis of the music, based on what have learned in class. Students will also discuss their observations about the concerts during our class meetings.

Students will also be able to discuss key points in the history of music in the world. - Our guests will discuss the lives of the composers whose works they perform, and they will discuss the musical styles periods when the compositions were originally written. This will give the students a well-rounded historical appreciation for the formation of these musical masterworks, embedded within specific historical time periods.

Students from **PAMU 161, 261, 262, 330, 361, 362, and 461** Music Theory, Aural Skills, and Jazz in America courses will also be benefited from these live performances. They will demonstrate to our students with handson, "ears-on" experiences. They will encourage and inspire them to explore the inner working of music, presenting notes, scales, and rhythms as they are heard in Classical music, pop, jazz, and musical theater.

PAMU 109/309: these performances will be very enlightening and educational for all PA students who are taking private music lessons at CI. The dedication and extensive training of our professional musical guests is evident in each note that they play. Students will have the opportunity to ask questions of these musical artists during the sessions.
