Brief Activity Description

This academic year-long series of in-class concerts will bring in high-level professional classical musicians from Los Angeles to CI, either in-person or over Zoom, depending on the state of the pandemic during the next semesters. Our guest artists will perform classical music repertoire for our two sections of the PAMU 337 "Music In History" course, our PAMU 100 Music Appreciation course, our Music Theory classes, and various other Performing Arts courses. Other CI students, faculty, staff, and community members are also welcome to attend these special concerts.

Our fantastic guest artists will demonstrate and discuss significant musical compositions by some of the greatest composers of all time: J.S. Bach, Beethoven, Mozart, Brahms, Claude Debussy, as well as contemporary composers. The Baroque, Classical, Romantic, Impressionist, and Modern musical style periods will be represented, giving students a rare up-close view of these masterworks being performed right before their very eyes. The musical selections that are presented by our guest artists correspond directly with the musical style periods and legendary composers that we study in our PAMU 337and PAMU 100 courses.

One concert for this course related performance series involves presenting a very high-level professional pianist to our campus to perform and demonstrate piano literature from the Baroque, Classical, Romantic, and Impressionist style periods.

Our other guest performances will be by professional ensembles, such as the Singer Chamber Players. The Singer Chamber Players are led by clarinetist David Singer. Mr. Singer was a long time member of the multiple Grammy Award winning Orpheus Chamber Orchestra (NYC). The Singer Chamber Players performed at Cl during past years, and their presentation was very well received by our students. Our musical guests do an outstanding job of verbally introducing each composition and providing a historical and stylistic context for each musical offering. There will be time allotted for our students to ask questions of our visiting artists.

Past students have overwhelmingly voiced support for these live concert events, and those students have stated that these concerts are very helpful for them to gain a full understanding of the musical concepts that are presented in this course.

Learning Outcomes & Relation to Course Offering

PAMU 337 Learning Outcomes:

- Show, through writing, discussion and oral presentation, an understanding of the course content and convey the key points of this course to an audience of their peers.
- Students will be required to write a detailed report about the concert/demonstrations, highlighting their observations and informed analysis of the music, based on what have learned in class. Students will also discuss their observations about the concerts during our class meetings.
- Discuss key points in the history of music in the world.
- Our guests will discuss the lives of the composers whose works they perform, and they will discuss the musical styles periods when the compositions were originally written. This will give the students a well-rounded historical appreciation for the formation of these musical masterworks, embedded within specific historical time periods.

PAMU 100 Learning Outcomes:

Students will be able to:

- demonstrate in writing their understanding of music as an art form;
- compare the musical styles of major periods in music;
- analyze their subjective and objective responses to a given piece of music;
- discuss in writing the characteristics of music of the major composers;
- identify generally the period a work of music not previously encountered;
- write intelligently about classical music concerts; articulate their understanding of the difference between classical music and popular music;
- discuss the way classical music is related to historical, political, economic and culture events,
- and speak knowledgeably about several of the most important musical genres and styles of the past and the present.

After our special performances, students will be able to obtain all of the skills above in much greater depth. Our musical guests also speak about the historical context of each composition that they perform. My students are assigned to write about these concerts, which prompts the students to tackle several of the outcomes listed above.

PAMU 308 Outcomes:

• Perform selected orchestral works using proper intonation and tone quality appropriate to the period and style of each work. Play in tune and blend with all other orchestral instruments. Play with correct articulation and rhythmic precision. Play with correct tone, bowing, and fingering techniques.

The students in our performing ensembles will observe all of the above performance qualities being brilliantly executed during these concert events.

PAMU 109/309 (Private Music Lessons) Learning Outcomes:

- Produce a proper (and pleasing) tone on their instrument.
- Play assigned solo works stylistically correct, using proper tone, expression, and embellishments from all stylistic periods.
- Demonstrate an understanding of the appropriate performance practice of the musical style of the works they are performing.

These professional concert performances will be very educational for all students who are taking private music lessons at CI. Students will see and hear great tones and style concepts being demonstrated by the professionals. For developing musicians, experiencing high quality professional performances is the best lesson of all! Students will also have the opportunity to ask questions of these musical artists during the sessions.

ACTIVITY TITLE: Music Appreciation (PAMU 100) Guest Performance Series

(The **PAMU 337 "Music in History"** class also participated) DATE (S) OF ACTIVITY: October 20, November 11, November 16

(1) PROVIDE A DESCRIPTION OF THE ACTIVITY

Due to the pandemic, these IRA activities took the form of Zoom performances by invited guest professional musicians, One presentation was by pianist/studio musician Gary Nesteruk, who has performed on over 100 Hollywood movie soundtracks. Another presentation was given by clarinetist David Singer and pianist Betty Oberbacker. Mr. Singer has performed for two U.S. Presidents and he performed on several Grammy winning recordings. Ms. Oberbacker has performed in many countries, and is Professor Emeritus at UCSB. During both of these presentations, students had opportunities to ask questions of our guest artists. Our third presentation was an interactive rhythm clinic that was given by nationally known author, drummer, and studio musician Ed Roscetti.

(2) HOW DID THE ACTIVITY RELATE TO A COURSE(S) AND/OR LEARNING OBJECTIVES?

Our PAMU 100 class learns about music and composers of the Baroque era, the Classical style period, the Romantic era, and jazz music and film music. Our guest artists customized a special program of music for our classes to feature the composers and musical styles from those time periods. Our musical guests prefaced each performance with a description of the composition's form, rhythm, and other compositional features and style elements. Our classes are learning about all those musical elements, so getting our guests' expert commentary was very valuable to the students.

This LIVE musical demonstration brought all those sounds and concepts home to the students via an up-close and personal experience. Our students were also able to ask questions of our guest artists. Overall, these concert experiences addressed our Learning Outcomes very directly and very effectively. Our guest musicians also answered questions about their own development as young musicians, and their practicing schedule. That information was enlightening for our music students who attended these two events.

(3) WHAT DO YOU SEE AS THE STRENGTHS OF THE ACTIVITY?

The strength of this activity was having very experienced world-class performers share their vast musical experience and performance abilities with our students. The artistic strength of these performances and our guests' expert commentary about the compositions being performed, gave our students an insider's view of the work of the world's most famous composers. The discussions about the musical forms, styles, and



rhythms of each composition gave our students a further insight into the music. Our students also had a chance to ask questions of the visiting artists.

(4) WHAT WOULD YOU SAY ARE/WERE THE ACTIVITY'S WEAKNESSES?

The inherent poor audio quality of ZOOM is a weakness. But I spent considerable time doing technical checks and sound checks with these artists in the days before their scheduled performances, so we succeeded in getting the Zoom sound quality as good as it could possible be

For an asynchronous class, it is difficult to find a time when every student can attend the live event. But I surveyed all the students to find the times when most of the students could attend the live event. These Zoom performances were also recorded, so that the other students could view the performances at a later time.

(5) HOW WOULD YOU IMPROVE THIS ACTIVITY FOR NEXT TIME?

The preparations that I mentioned for question #4 succeeded in fully improving these activities.

(6) WHAT DID YOU LEARN FROM THE PROCESS?

I learned how important it is to do the afore-mentioned sound checks and tech checks for these Zoom events. This semester further reinforced to me how very important it is for our students to SEE and HEAR these types of art music LIVE. Very few of our students ever see live musicians perform, so this was an excellent way to provide the students with real performances of the musical styles that we teach them about in class.



How did this activity relate to the content and/or learning outcomes of the courses that you are taking?

We are learning about music so it gave us a hands on performance for us to observe everything we have learned throughout the semester.

The performers played pieces from artists and composers that we are learning about.

The guest performers played music composed by the composers learned in the course.

The pieces played were related to the historical period we are learning of

It talked directly about music from the Baroque and the Classical eras, and that was what we ere studying at the time.

The pieces that were being performed were from Classical and Baroque period which is relevant to the music era that we are learning about.

We are learning about music from Baroque and Classical era and this activity consisted of performances of compositions from that time period.

This activity related to the content we are learning because we are currently learning about the classical era. The instruments he plays and the type of songs that he plays go under that category.

We listened to different pieces being performed by very accomplished musicians. The types and eras of music that was played related to the music we were learning about.

It allowed me to see what we are learning in the textbook in a real work example

The virtual Zoom concert related to the course I am taking in the sense that we got to hear the works of many of the composers we have been studying this semester. In addition to listening to pieces of music from different musical eras, the performers also gave us some relevant historical information about the different composers and about how society was at the time when the different composers lived.

it related in regards to knowing and understanding the form and context of music performed in the 17-19th centuries, in which the performers also gave guidance and advise about why the pieces were so well known.

There were some great performers that we had the privilege of listening to.

It related to previous chapters where we learned about Bach and Mozart and the Baroque and Classical period which were the time periods and performers discussed in the Guest performance.

We are learning about the Classical, Age of Reason, and Romantic Period. We have been learning about composers such as Beethoven, Bach, and Chopin. The performers performed those composers' pieces and showed us how to identify the elements in them that distinguish them from each other.

We got to witness accomplished musicians perform and give history on music theory and practices

Clarinetist David Singer and Pianist Betty Oberacker performed pieces from the Baroque, Classical, and Romantic era from different composers and demonstrated the different dynamics, tempos, and rhythms; which is what were learning about in class.

The clarinet and piano concert gave us an opportunity to watch a live performance in order to analyze it and apply what we are learning

Our most recent section in class was based around the baroque, classical, and romantic period and the guest performers exhibited great skill and knowledge in the history and concepts of music from these eras.


The musicians performed pieces from all four of the time periods demonstrating a vast repertoire as well as great historical information.

Audio quality is never as good over the internet as it is in real life but nevertheless, it was necessary during the current circumstances.


I personally feel that there were no weakness during this activity, and I really enjoyed everything about it.

How did this activity relate to the content and/or learning outcomes of the courses that you are taking?

It relates as we are learning how to listen and understand different instruments and which genres they are most associated with.

The piano demonstration from Gary Nestruk was a useful video to watch as he discussed how he came to be and the way pianos worked.

mainly it talked about the weekly time of the chapters that we've been studying.

We are learning about Mozart and music itself

The pianist played pieces by composers that we have or will learn about in the semester

I think live music is very informal and beneficial to what we have been learning. It was very cool for us to actually see a live performance and recognize many aspects of what we have been taught by our professor.

We got to hear Gary Nesteruk play a series of Beethoven pieces on the piano and ask him questions regarding classical music and about Beethoven in general. Nesteruk also showed us some of the movie scores he has worked on and gave us insight into how different moods are portrayed through music in movies. It all related to the class in the sense that we got to experience Beethoven more in-depth than we would normally. I personally think the Zoom event gave me a much better understanding of music from the classical era, as well as getting a better understanding of what in specific made Beethoven's musical works masterpieces.

It basically was just a live performance of a music genre that we learned about in class. The performer gave us a mini lesson about the notes and the characteristics of the song.

Gary Nesteruk is a pianist and the performance he did gave us a close look at classical music and he also explained a lot about the piano itself

Played music related to the periods of time covered in the course.

We have been learning about the different styles of music and what elements help create it. We have also watched a documentary on J.S Bach and learning why is music structure is appreciated all over the world. We've seen different types of performances like jazz, folk, and blues music.

This activity gave us a hands on learning experience. We were able to see someone perform first hand and experience something that we have been reading about and studying for the whole semester.

In lecture, we were on a classical music section and the subject of the performance was based on the piano works of Bach and Beethoven.

It demonstrated to us the real-world application of music in how a piece is composed of a specific scene of a movie. Also since we are learning about past composers, the guest performer performed pieces from J.S> Bach and Beethoven which we are greatly learning about. It reinforces the material with a live performance.

It showed different music pieces and how they are played.

The activity/ performance showed us several piano pieces from composers we are currently learning about: like Bach Beethoven. He performed the piece, showing us the notations and tempo of each song.

The guest performer played musical compositions for us in order to help better understand music and it's impact.

Gary played a handful of fugues and pieces by Bach and Beethoven, which I have been learning to do the last year and half since joining CSUCI.

Since I am taking a musical course the performance on the piano was amazing and showed a lot that was read in my readings, from crescendos to changes in tone to the variation of sound quality.


It helped give a live demonstration of classical baroque music.

(1) PROVIDE A DESCRIPTION OF THE ACTIVITY

On **October 2, 2019** we had two high-profile Blues music artists perform for our class. Ms. Janiva Magness is an incredible blues vocalist who has been the recipient of some of the highest awards in that field, including the B.B. King Entertainer of the Year Award from the Memphis Blues Foundation. Accompanying Janiva was legendary Orange County blues guitarist David "Kid" Ramos. In addition to performing classic blues repertoire, Magness and Ramos told the students lots of insider information about the songs and composers whom they were showcasing. These artists also performed for my PAMU 200 class later that day.

On **October 16**th, we brought in the "310" band to perform for the class. The "310" band consists of Grammy Award winning producer and guitarist Josh Sklair, and two fabulous, in-demand L.A. musicians: Michael Saucier on bass, and drummer Les Falconer. These musicians (with myself also performing) demonstrated a variety of Jazz music tunes for the class. The "310" band also performed Rock and Roll classics later in the same day for my History of Rock class.

(2) HOW DID THE ACTIVITY RELATE TO A COURSE(S) AND/OR LEARNING OBJECTIVES?

Our PAMU 100 class learns about many styles, including jazz music and blues music. Our guest artists customized a special program of music for our classes to listen to classic blues and jazz compositions. The class lectures had already introduced some of those compositions to the students, so it was very enlightening for our students to see live, in-person performances of those tunes. Our musical guests prefaced each performance with a description of the composition's form, rhythm, and other compositional features and style elements. Our classes are learning about all those musical elements, so getting our guests' expert commentary was very valuable to the students.

These LIVE musical demonstrations brought to life all of the concepts that the students are learning in their textbook and in my lectures. Our students were also able to ask questions of our guest artists. Overall, these concert experiences addressed our Learning Outcomes very directly and very effectively. Our guest musicians also answered questions about their own development as young musicians, and their practicing schedule. That information was enlightening for our music majors who attended these two events.

(3) WHAT DO YOU SEE AS THE STRENGTHS OF THE ACTIVITY?

The strength of this activity was having very experienced world-class performers visit our campus for two days of musical presentations for our students. The artistic



strength of these performances and our guests' expert commentary about the compositions being performed, gave our students an insider's view of the work of the world's most famous composers. The discussions about the musical forms, styles, and rhythms of each composition gave our students a further insight into the music. Our students also had a chance to ask questions of the visiting artists. Another strength was that both groups were able to stay and perform for a second class of students later in the day.

(4) What would you say are/were the activity's weaknesses?

The feedback from our students was very positive. One thing we are looking to improve is to seek for a better performance space when we have these excellent guest performances on campus, so that we can better serve our campus community. Are world-class guest artists shouldn't have to compete with the dance class' excessive dance track music volume that leaks in from the adjacent classroom.

(5) HOW WOULD YOU IMPROVE THIS ACTIVITY FOR NEXT TIME?

We have done our best to maximize the extraordinary experience we could bring to our students in our classes. My goal would be keep improving on promoting such events to a broader audience in our campus community.

(6) WHAT DID YOU LEARN FROM THE PROCESS?

I have hosted about 75 of these musical events during my years of teaching at CI. This semester further reinforced to me how very important it is for our students to SEE and HEAR these types of art music LIVE. Very few of our students ever see live musicians perform, so this was an excellent way to provide the students with real performances of the musical styles that we teach them about in class.





The strengths of this activity is how much more personal it is than anything in the textbook or any video we could watch. I think we often lose the value of real artists especially while studying music because we can easily listen to a song from anywhere. However, listening and watching a live performance is something else entirely; it's not even just listening to music anymore. It becomes a feeling that is very intimate from artist to audience.

Being able to recognize the types of music firsthand and understand it from a perfomer's perspective

I liked how the musicians got into the history of the Blues and also liked the way they performed.

The positives were that we got to see how each song is performed/covered and get a sense of what it sounds like in live.

I felt that it was a lot of fun and I learned a lot. It's not often that you get to meet two blues experts who are willing to play music live for you.

For those who never originally went out to live concert performances on their own before coming to college, it showed them how exciting and personal the experience could be. It also gave way for students to interact with professionals and hear stories and how it shapes their musical performance. They also demonstrated exactly what we were learning it class so it was a good experience for visual learners.

I consider the positives to be the actual concert experience, and getting a chance to speak with real artists about things we learned in the classroom

Personally, I feel like the positives of this activity are the first hand experiences that we are being provided and the opportunity to speak to musicians and receive more information, through their point of view and experiences, on the content being taught in the course.







How did this activity relate to the content and/or learning outcomes of the...

It relates because the music that was played connected to the era we were learning about

I learned about jazz music and especially about how musicians improvise together.

This course was put on during my music appreciation class. It directly related to what we were learning in my music class about jazz music in our class, and showed us in person how a jazz band works.

They played a lot of song that we were learning about in the Jazz section, such as the song Summertime. We got to see how improvisation worked among a live jazz performance which I learned a lot from. I also got to see first hand how these performers would time out their music, as learned in this chapter.

For this class concert, we had three musicians play Jazz music for us. The content relates to the Jazz chapters that the class was tested on not too long ago. 
We got to listen first hand to the music we are learning in class and got to see how the instruments are used
