Brief Activity Description

This multicultural, internationally themed concert/demonstration series is designed for the PAMU 332 World Music course. This IRA funded concert series has been ongoing feature of our PAMU 332 courses for more than 10 years. This culturally rich educational series has been a hallmark offering of the CI Performing Arts Department. The goal of this performance/demonstration series is to expose CI students to a variety of music and cultural experiences from around the world. We will present four different concerts throughout the semester that feature expert ethnic music guest soloists, or small ensembles.

Our guests will demonstrate various world music styles of music, along with the special ethnic instruments that produce those sounds. The students will interact with our guest musicians through the process of musical participation, and through discussions with the artists. Some of the exciting guests we typically bring to CI for this concert series include: a kora player from Senegal, Africa, an ensemble of Celtic musicians who will perform traditional Irish music, a master Sitarist and Tabla player who will perform and demonstrate Indian classical music, a wonderful Spanish Flamenco dancer & guitarist to demonstrate and discuss Flamenco music from Spain, an interactive percussion clinic where the students get hands on experience playing drums and percussion, and a Latin music ensemble that demonstrates bossa nova, salsa, cha cha, samba, and bolero music.

These performances will be very beneficial to our students' understanding of this course's core concepts, which include exposure to a diverse range of music from around the world. The concerts will also foster the understanding and appreciation of different international cultures, which is among our main mission statements (pillars) here at CI.

Learning Outcomes & Relation to Course Offering

PAMU 332 Learning Outcomes:

- Describe orally and in writing the diverse styles and cultures of world music. My class will be assigned to write reflection & analysis papers about these concerts, which also reinforces our "Writing Across the Curriculum" mission. Students will also give verbal feedback about the concert experiences in the form of VoiceThread posts.

- Write about a world music concert they attend. This Outcome is also addressed by the post-concert writing assignments that are connected to the performances.

- Discuss in writing, musical characteristics and genres of indigenous music. Several indigenous musical styles will be heard during this concert series. This Outcome is also addressed by the writing assignments connected to the performances.

- Differentiate between diverse musical styles of several countries and regions. From witnessing these concerts, students will learn to differentiate and identify various musics from around the globe.

- Identify songs or styles of world music not previously encountered. Students will definitely be exposed to many new and previously unfamiliar world music styles and compositions during these performances. On follow up assignments, students will be asked to identify and differentiate between those world music styles.

- Discuss how world music is related to historical, political and cultural events. Many of our guest artists will be discussing their music within the context of the cultural, political, and historical events of their homeland.

Students will be prepped for each concert by the learning the basics of the particular music style during a series of class meetings. Then at the performances, the lessons will come to life with our live performances. Students will also have the opportunity to ask questions of these musical artists during the sessions.

OTHER CLASSES: These performances will be educational and inspiring for all of our PAMU 109 and 309 private music lesson students and ensemble members. These musical experiences will also directly benefit the students of our PAMU 337 Music in History course, and our PAMU 100 Music Appreciation courses.

(1) PROVIDE A DESCRIPTION OF THE ACTIVITY

This series of six concerts in the Spring semester of 2019 brought in many top tier professional musicians to perform for our students, and to enlighten the students about the fascinating world of music. Our guest musicians included specialist performers of Irish, Flamenco, African, and Hindustani Indian music. We also hosted an interactive percussion clinic that was led by a recognized drumming expert from L.A., where students got to play a variety of ethnic percussion instruments while they learned traditional African and Cuban rhythm patterns.

(2) HOW DID THE ACTIVITY RELATE TO A COURSE(S) AND/OR LEARNING OBJECTIVES?

My PAMU 332 World Music class learns about the varieties of music that are produced by diverse cultures from around our planet. This series of IRA funded in-class performances by experts in ethnic music styles has given the students a much deeper appreciation for the music of each of the cultures that the students learned about. Please make sure to read the student comments later in this document that prove that the students' learning of the course objectives was greatly enhanced by these IRA events. In addition to performing the music, each of our guest artists spoke about the cultural importance of the music (and dance) that they were presenting.

My students in both classes were also assigned writing projects about these concerts, which further address our course's learning objectives and our campus' Writing Across the Curriculum mission.

In addition, my Beatles class also got to experience a live performance of sitar and tabla music from India. That presentation aided the students' understanding of the Indian music sounds that George Harrison brought into some of the Beatles' recordings.

(3) WHAT DO YOU SEE AS THE STRENGTHS OF THE ACTIVITY?

The strengths of these activities were the fantastic opportunities for our students to witness a variety of multicultural ethnic music being performed up close and personal. The attached student feedback demonstrates that the students gained a much better understanding and appreciation about these

musical topics by witnessing these live performances, and by hearing the informative commentaries from our expert musical guests.

(4) WHAT WOULD YOU SAY ARE/WERE THE ACTIVITY'S WEAKNESSES?

I saw no weaknesses in this activity. The students enjoyed the experiences very much, and their learning was greatly enhanced by these very special live music experiences as they interacted with top level professional musicians who specialize in the performance of ethnic music.

This concert series reinforced everything that I have seen before when teaching these courses, which is that these live music performances are very essential to the learning process. (1) PROVIDE A DESCRIPTION OF THE ACTIVITY

This series of five concerts in the Fall semester of 2018 brought in many professional musicians to perform for our students, and to enlighten the students about multicultural music form around the world. Our guest musicians included specialist performers of Irish, Flamenco, African, and Hindustani Indian music. We also hosted an interactive percussion clinic that was led by a recognized drumming expert from L.A., where students got to play a variety of ethnic percussion instruments while they learned traditional African and Cuban rhythm patterns.

(2) HOW DID THE ACTIVITY RELATE TO A COURSE(S) AND/OR LEARNING OBJECTIVES?

My PAMU 332 World Music class learns about various types of music that are produced by cultures around our planet. This series of in-class performances by pro musicians who are experts in ethnic music styles gave the students a deep appreciation for the music of each culture that was presented. The accompanying comments from the students do show proof that the students' learning was greatly enhanced by these IRA events. In addition to performing the musical compositions, our guest artists spoke about the cultural importance of the music (and dance) that they were presenting.

My students were also assigned writing projects about these concerts, which further address our course's learning objectives, and our campus' Writing Across the Curriculum mission.

(3) WHAT DO YOU SEE AS THE STRENGTHS OF THE ACTIVITY?

The strengths of these activities were the fantastic opportunities for students to witness a variety of multicultural ethnic music being performed up close and personal. Our students always say that these live performances bring our in-class lessons to life in the best way possible.

(4) WHAT WOULD YOU SAY ARE/WERE THE ACTIVITY'S WEAKNESSES?

I saw no weaknesses in this activity. Except that our school's available performance spaces are so dreadful. We are bringing world class musical artists to CI, but the available "stages" at CI are not even as nice as the local high schools' or community colleges' performing facilities

No improvements are necessary. The students enjoyed the experiences very much, and these concerts were an important part of their learning. We will continue to bring these educational music performances to our CI students.

This multicultural concert series reinforced everything that I have seen in previous semesters while teaching this course, which is that these live music performances are very essential to the learning process. As the students have said in their feedback surveys, experiencing these music performances in a live setting – has way more impact upon them than only being able to use You-Tube videos and streaming digital music tracks.

This activity taught the class how to keep rhythm by marching to the beat of the drummers. We even learned how to use "shakers" and drums after they demonstrated.

It helped to reinforce the ideas about rhythm that we are learning in class. This was especially helpful for me because I am not a musician and thus have never actually been hands on with many of the music concepts we are discussing.

The activity relates in several manners. First, the rhythm class taught us about the beat measures that percussion instruments are usually played on. Second, it introduced some drums that are used in African music. Finally, it was a introduction into learning to play music together and cohesively.

This activity exemplifies musical concepts we studied in class.

It focused primarily on rhythm which we need to understand in the world music class and we can actually use rhythm in our African Drumming class.

we are learning about rhythm in world music and all the components that go along with it, within music. this activity tought me how to feel rhythm rather than just hearing it.

This activity relates to the content outcomes of PAMU 332 because chapter 11 in our textbook talks about samba and other Latin music.
