Brief Activity Description

Noche de Familia is a student transition and retention event which highlights academic success through connections with staff, faculty, alumni and community. The event's main goal is to inform an audience of largely monolingual Spanish-speaking parents about university services, support, and opportunities. We welcome CI students and their families within and outside the university's service area. Ultimately, the goal is to strengthen a college-going and completion tradition among families to advance student success. Noche de Familia helps us further our aims toward creating an inclusive campus for our students and their families, a central pillar of CI in fulfilling our responsibilities as a Hispanic Serving Institution (HSI).

The pre-event Family Outreach Institute welcomes students and their families from high schools in the region. We will target the outreach invitations to admitted students from OUHSD and siblings of current CI students. Family workshops presented in Spanish include Financial Literacy-emphasizing financial aid, College 101, and a Student Panel discussion. The dinner program includes faculty, staff, student, and alumni speakers, who share stories of their educational journeys while serving as models for academic student success. Culturally relevant entertainment is provided before, during and after the event.

The collaborative committee providing project oversight consists of the Chicana/o Latina/o Faculty & Staff Association (ChiLFSA) Executive Board, the Student Academic Success & Equity Initiatives unit, and other faculty and staff representing various areas of the Division of Academic Affairs, largely but not solely.

The CSU Grad 2025 Initiative places a higher level of accountability on CI to be responsive to the societal and institutional barriers which lead to lower levels of academic student success and perpetuate equity gaps among our diverse student population. Noche de Familia's culturally-relevant programming is intended to move the needle on outreach, engagement, and degree completion, directly in alignment with CI's Graduation Initiative 2025 institutional goals and HSI status. This project leads to positive student outcomes such as increased retention and graduation rates.

Noche de Familia will call on the support and participation of at least 30 CI students, faculty and staff members to serve as event promoters, volunteers, ushers, table hosts, and guest speakers. "Noche de Familia Ambassadors" will share their own stories of success at CI as well as highlight the impact of campus programs and services in this regard. The parents of students will share their experiences of how they supported their sons or daughters in their academic journey. At the conclusion of the event, bilingual evaluations will be distributed to all participants to collect data about the effectiveness of the event as well as to capture the impact of programming.

Introduction to Chicana/o Studies (CHS 100-Luna); Chicana/o Cultural Expressions (CHS 160-Centino); Chicana/o History & Culture (CHS 350-Alamillo); Southern California Chicana/o History & Culture (HIST402-Barajas); Spanish for Heritage Speakers I and II

Learning Outcomes & Relation to Course Offering

Introduction to Chicana/o Studies (CHS 100-JennieLuna): Students will read about the traditional and contemporary Chicana/o family and then attend Noche de Familia. They will be required to attend the event and reflect upon the programming and speakers and make connections to course readings.

Chicana/o Cultural Expressions(CHS160-Nicholas Centino): Students will read about artists who have created representations of the Chicana/o family in art, media and film/video. They will be required to attend the event and reflect upon the programming and speakers and make connections to course readings.

Chicana/o History and Culture (CHS/HIST 350-Jose Alamillo): Students will read and discuss the history of the Chicana/o family from the 19th century to the 21st century. They will be required to attend the event and reflect upon the programming and speakers and make connections to course readings.

Sociology of Education (SOC 365-Karina Chavarria): In this class, students will read on the importance of family in fostering educational goals and academic success across the K-College pipeline. Students will be required to attend the event and will submit a reflection piece on the activities and experiences in the events.

Southern California Chicana/o History and Culture (CHS/HIST 402-Frank Barajas): Students will read and discuss readings that focus on the Chicano/a family in southern California, They will be required to attend the event and reflect upon the programming and speakers and make connections to course readings.

Spanish for Heritage Speakers I and II (SPAN 211/SPAN 212-Lopez & Barron Camacho): Students will attend the event and analyze the linguistic diversity in the event, practice their Spanish skills, and reflect on the importance of Spanish speaking events in higher education institutions in the U.S. Students will have to interview one of the attendees on their experience.

Her Story: Women Writers of the Spanish-Speaking World (SPAN 430-Maricela Becerra): Students will read testimonios and analyze their role on community making throughout Latin American literature. Students will attend the event and write a collective testimonio reflecting on its importance and role in the education of first generation Latino/a/x students.
