Brief Activity Description

Monica Muñoz Martinez, professor of History at University of Texas, Austin, will present a talk on the forgotten history of anti-Mexican violence in the United States.

Professor Martinez will draw on research conducted for her award-winning book, The Injustice Never Leaves You: Anti-Mexican Violence in Texas (Harvard University Press, 2018) and as the founding member of Refusing to Forget, a non-profit organizations that calls for a public reckoning with the history of state-sanctioned racial violence in Texas.

These past injustices have lasting consequences to the present day. Not only do they continue with the survivors and victim's relatives and descendants, they also continue to shape institutional policies and practices. Dr. Martinez will discuss why anti-Mexican violence by Texas Rangers, law enforcement, and border patrol have persisted to the present day.

Dr. Martinez will deliver a 60-minute campus presentation, with 30 minutes of Q & A session, followed by a book signing. Dr. Martinez will also meet with a small group of students and faculty to discuss how they can resist and challenge forms of anti-Mexican violence in their communities. A student assistant will be hired to administer and facilitate this IRA activity.
