**Brief Activity Description** 

This creative digital humanities project will bring together faculty, staff, students, and the community to create a virtual Kwanzaa celebration. The project will include

- Research and collaborative development of a script on Kwanzaa history and a daily principle candle-lighting script (October)
- Collaborative development of a community art-making project (October)
- Dissemination of art materials to participants (November)
- A real-time community art-making event hosted via Zoom (November)
- Record daily candle-lighting ceremony (November)
- Post daily candle-lighting ceremony on social media each day during Kwanzaa (December-January)
- A virtual Karamu, African feast, held on December 31.
- Create a Canvas module for archiving and use of the recorded ceremony in other multicultural teaching contexts and to augment Black History Month programming and teaching materials (January-February)

AFS 202 Introduction to Africana Studies, ENGL 325: Major-Non-Western Authors

**Learning Outcomes & Relation to Course Offering** 

The learning outcome for this project is to promote a class and broader campus culture that values and fosters diversity.

The course AFS: 202 Introduction to Africana studies is meant to provide an understanding of contemporary African American cultural production. My project engages this goal by endeavoring to celebrate African-American history and cultural expression in a virtual environment.

I would like to use primary art-making materials and secondary research sources to develop an art-making project that includes **first collaboratively researching Kwanzaa** as a form of local African-American cultural production **before coming together virtually to make art and creating content for a digital Kwanzaa practice**. In the spirit of the local environmental non-profit The Human Nature Center's work, Dr. Meg Handler will host a virtual art-making event. Through this work, students will learn to see themselves positively reflected in and embraced by CI culture. Seeing Black culture positively reflected in and supported by CI practices helps support the success of Black students and the development of anti-racist frames of reference for all students. Racialized identities are a key way we understand our selves and a primary way in which we are legible to each other in the contemporary world. This activity, as well as AFS 202 more broadly, want to offer students rich ways with which to interact with Black cultural production and Black identification.

This project focuses on developing a digital humanities project that asks for an intellectual and emotional engagement with Black cultural production and then producing art together, a cross-cultural or multicultural activity. To coexist across different identities first requires a nuanced perspective on the experiences of different identities and the symbolic imaginaries we use to represent those everyday lived experiences. This activity requires both engagement with Black symbolic imaginaries –the seven principles and symbols of Kwanzaa – and making art together as a way to express each of our own artistic experiences, with a digital dissemination model to add further context and reflection.

English 325: Major Non-Western Authors will focus on how art is used in processes of truth and reconciliation in Black and indigenous communities. This African American-focused art-making activity will provide students a chance to have experiential engagement with course concepts and methods.

This project encourages developing a multicultural community at California State University Channel Islands by

- researching and producing digital content to explain the historical origins of Kwanzaa.
- centering practices of Black belonging and community building.
- inviting broad community participation by posting the content on social media platforms.
- producing educational content that will be housed on Canvas.
- inviting community members, faculty, staff, and students to reflect on the 7 principles (Umoja, Kujichagulia, Ujima, Ujamaa, Nia, Kuumba, Imani).
- building community through a virtual art-making project.
