Discussion on Masters in History:

Jeanne brought up there is no support for graduate programs at State side.

Blake G.: It brings up back to the resource allocation discussion from last week.

Scott F.: We are not where we need to be as far as graduate education infra structure. It is a question for President Beck, if graduate education will be a priority for this institution.

Blake G.: in the CC we are working with the complete package for the programs and courses and late proposals are hard.

Scott F.: Recommends that in the next Senate meeting to bring up about the submission to the Curriculum Committee

Master's in Public Administration is Scott, it was in the original Master Plan but we are not ready. The task force of 2005 agreed to postpone it.

Scott designed the Master's in PA but it did not go through Senate. In 2016 Scott updated the curriculum. They decided to wait until next year for the new hire in PA so they can put their own spin on it and move forward. He wants the Master's in PA to stay in the Master Plan. They are very popular.

Blake G.: Loops back to faculty hiring. Infra structure. Do we hire before you have the program.

Scott F.: I would like the cart before the horses, the hire before the program. The new 3 candidates for POLS know that the program in the plans but it is not guarantee.

Blake G.: Transparency with hiring the faculty
