Who does the applicant purchase and prepare food with? *(Please note, spouses, parents, and children under 22 who live together must apply as one household, even if they don't buy and prepare food together.)*

Use the number of people in the household to find the row on the chart below for the next question.



Is the household under the gross monthly income limit?

If **yes**, go to the next question.

If **no**, the household is not likely eligible.

CalFresh Income Limit & Benefit Allotments

CalFresh Household: a person living alone or a group of people living together who purchase and prepare food together.



Does the household include at least one U.S. citizen, U.S. national, LPR/ Green Card holder, Cuban/Haitian Entrant, or COFA citizen?

If **yes**, go to the next question.

If **no**, the household is likely not eligible.

If **unsure**, apply for a full determination.



Does anyone in household participate in the Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations (FDPIR)?

If **yes**, the household is not eligible.

If **no**, go to the next question.



Does anyone in the household receive 10 or less meals per week from another source (like a campus meal plan)?

If **yes**, go to the next question.

If **no**, and applicant is receiving over 10 meals a week, the household is likely not eligible.



Is anyone in the household a college student per CalFresh guidelines: enrolled at least half-time and between the ages of 18-49?

If **yes**, go to the next question.

If **no**, the applicant does not meet the student eligibility rule, but may need to meet [Work and Community Engagement requirements](#).



Is the college student physically or mentally unable to work or is receiving disability benefits?

If **yes**, please apply for CalFresh.

If **no**, review the student eligibility rule section.

Student Eligibility Rule

Students (enrolled at least half-time and between ages of 18-49) also need to meet **at least one** of the following:

- **Working** and getting paid an average of **20 hours per week** or an average of **80 hours a month**.
- **Approved (or awarded or accepted) for federal or state work study**, anticipates working, and have not refused a work assignment.
 - May still be eligible if a work study job has not started or is not available.
- Students attending CSU, UC or private university **receiving TANF-funded Cal Grant A or B**, and that have received a letter from the California Student Aid Commission (CSAC) noting that they might be eligible for CalFresh benefits.



• **Enrolled in** Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (**WIOA**) or in a Local Program that Increases Employability (**LPIE**).

- As of **June 1, 2026**, associate and bachelor's degree programs at CCCs, CSUs, and UCs are approved as LPIEs, including associate degrees for transfer and undeclared students.

• Other programs may still qualify as LPIEs.

• **Exerting parental control over a dependent household member** under the age of 6 OR between the age of 6 and 12 with no adequate childcare (as determined by the associate on a case-by-case basis) OR are a single parent of dependent household member under the age of 12.

• **Participating in** the CalFresh Employment and Training Program (**CFET**) or Job Opportunities and Basic Skills (**JOBS**), or be a recipient of CalWORKs or Aid to Families with Dependent Children (**AFDC**).

Other Things to Consider

• As of March 1, 2026, **most educational financial aid does not count as income**.

• **International, DACA, and DREAM students will not be eligible**, even with a work VISA/ Social Security Number.

• **Out-of-state students can still be eligible** for CalFresh if they are living in California.
