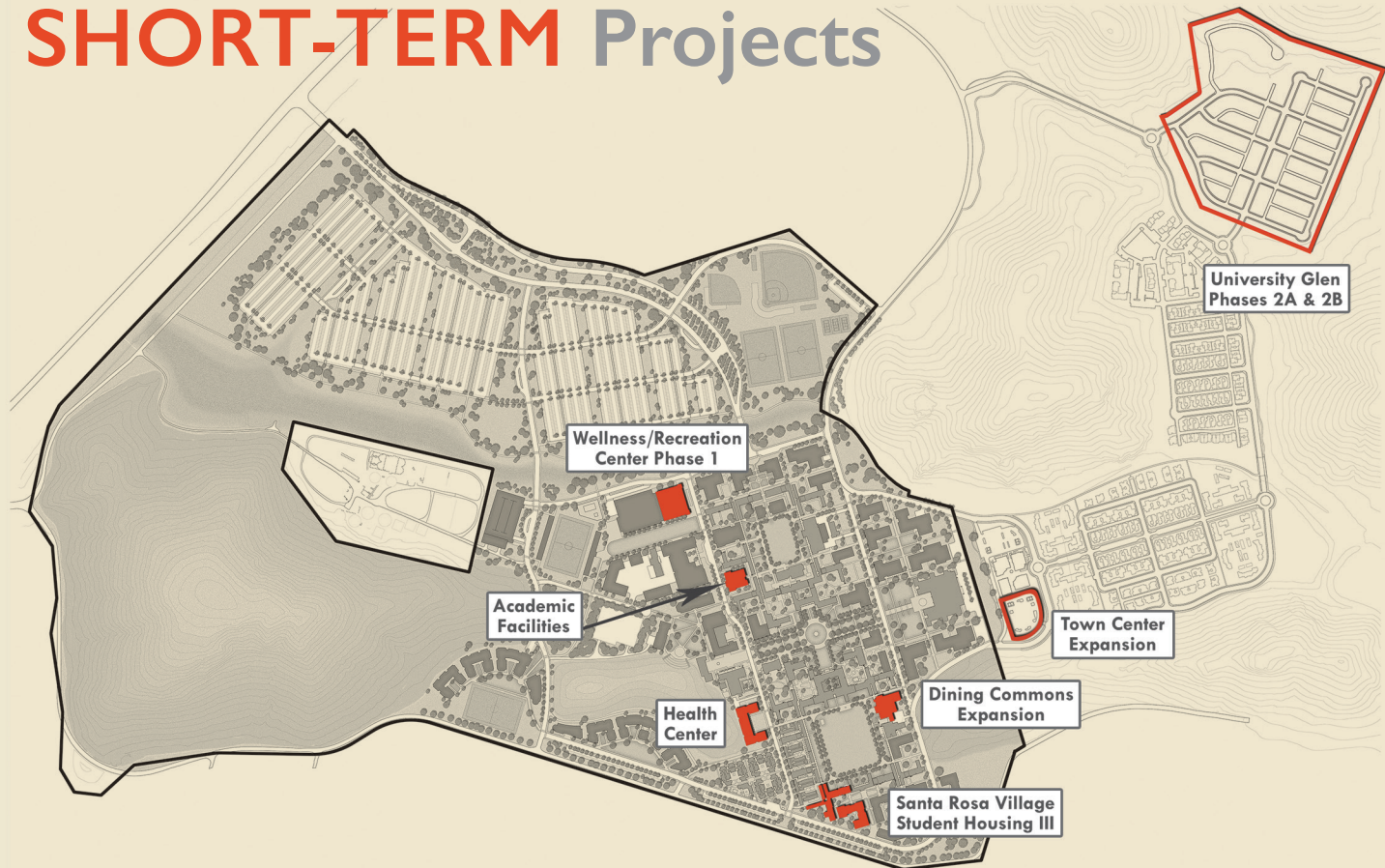
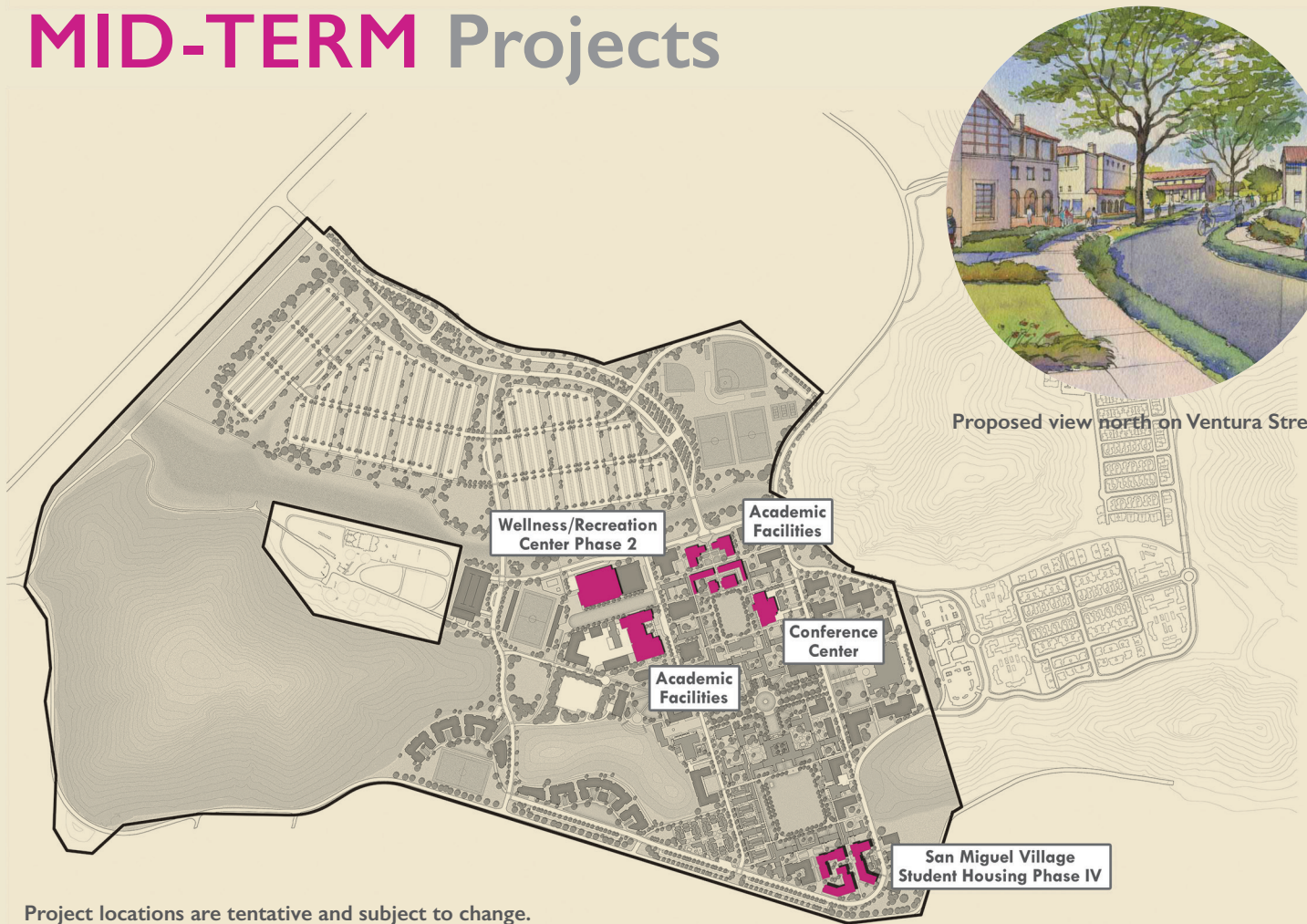

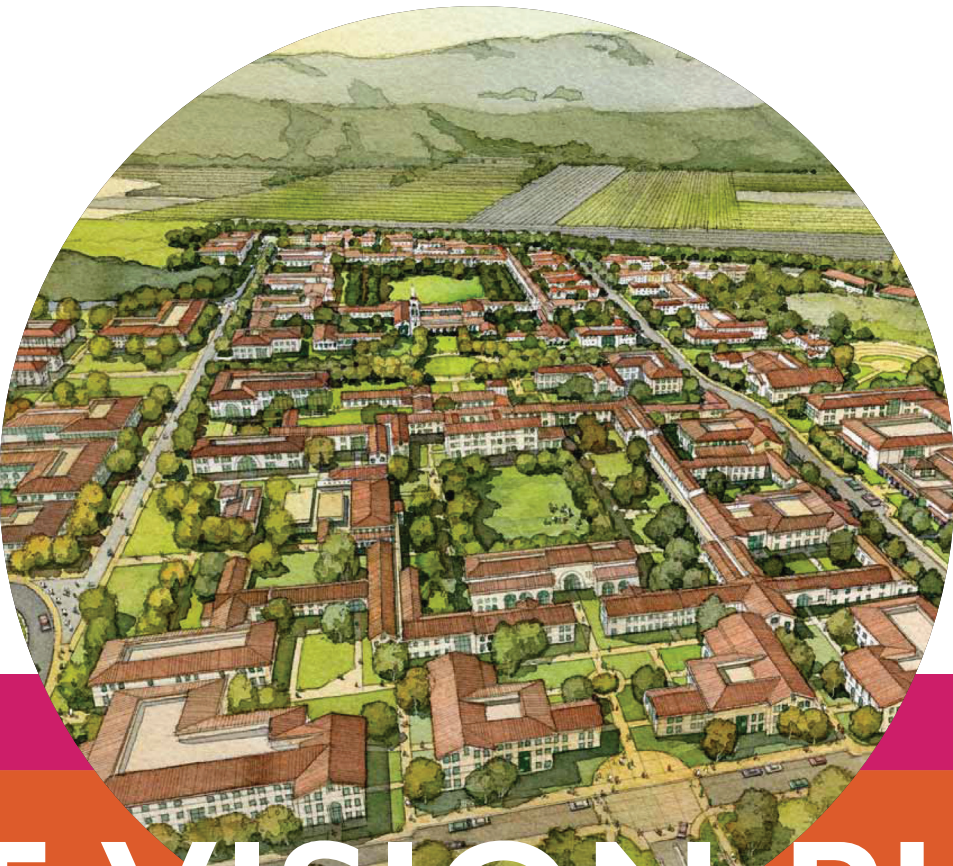

KEEPING PACE WITH STUDENT AND COMMUNITY NEEDS

As the only four-year public university in Ventura County between Northridge and Santa Barbara, CSU Channel Islands (CI) plays a major role in the success and well-being of our community. We provide qualified applicants for the workforce. Our students serve as interns in local businesses and participate in service learning programs that benefit more than 60 schools, governmental agencies and charitable organizations. We expand opportunities for underserved populations. And, we support economic growth by providing jobs and stimulating our local economy.

OUTPACING EXPECTATIONS

We've accomplished great things since CI's inception in 2002, and much of it is due to you. CI is the newest campus in the CSU system and has been hit hard by state budget cuts for most of our history. Without support from our friends in the private sector and local government, we couldn't have expanded our offerings and wouldn't have achieved our current level success and traction. We've outpaced expectations in the higher education community, and the future is bright. CSU Chancellor Timothy White has stated that CI will be "one of the jewels of the Cal State system."

These amenities include a wellness and recreation center, a performing arts venue, an athletics program, a conference center, and much more.
