## CSU Channel Islands University Park

### *Temporary Model Glider Area*

The CSU Channel Islands University Park is an education and recreation area owned and operated by California State University Channel Islands (CI). As an extension of the academic campus, the Park embraces the mission, values and objectives of CI. The purpose of the Park is to provide educational and recreational opportunities open to all through habitat restoration activities, maintenance of open spaces, and development of ecological, cultural, and recreational facilities and programs.

## Rules and Regulations

1. The operation of any form of model aircraft is prohibited on University property in any area(s) other than those designated for such use.
2. The park is limited to model gliders only in the designated area. Operators are to control gliders from designated flight lines in accordance with selected flight patterns. The fly zones, locations and hours of the designated flying fields are listed on this brochure.
3. All persons operating model gliders while on University Park property must have valid University Model Glider Permit in their possession. For permit information, call (805) 437-8846.
4. Use of designated areas shall be on a first-come, first-served basis, except when exclusive use approval has been obtained from the University through the Events & Facilities Committee.
5. Gliders shall be limited to a weight of 2lbs. or less.
6. To reserve a frequency, operators should affix current University permits or pins with their names to the control stand to indicate which radio bands are being used when flying. All other radios must be turned off when not in use.
7. Operators are to yield the right-of-way to landing aircraft or to aircraft on the runway that have just landed.
8. Transmitters should only be operated while persons are flying model aircraft. Operators should double check other transmitters to make sure no one is flying on the same frequency.

### **Accessibility**

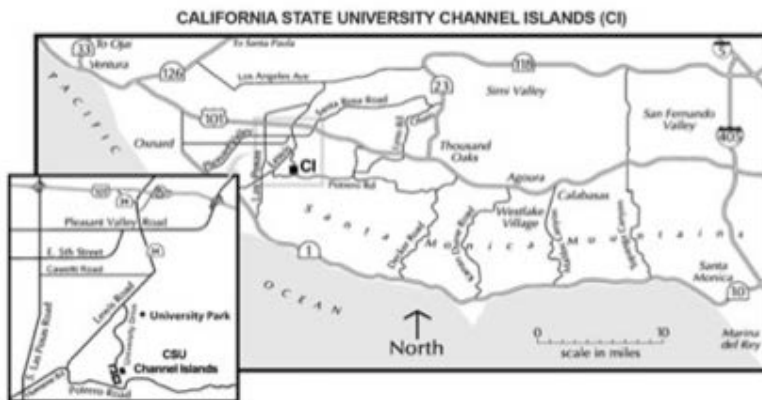

## Park Hours and Access

C.I. Park is generally open and accessible seven days a week from sunrise to sunset with the following exceptions:

- Access to some or all sections of C.I. Park and its trails may be restricted as a result of a public safety concern, inclement weather, or planned events;
- No person shall enter areas restricted or closed for restoration or research projects, or any other area, as indicated by posted signs, fences, gates, or other barriers, except through the express written permission of the University.

**MODEL GLIDER TEMPORARY PERMIT RULES AND REGULATIONS**

**TEMPORARY PERMITS ARE VALID THROUGH JUNE 30, 2013**

1. All persons operating a model glider while on University property must possess a valid University Model Glider Permit.
2. The University Park model glider field is designated for radio controlled non-powered gliders only. G l i d e r flying is permitted during park open hours unless posted otherwise.
3. It is the responsibility of the permit holder to respect fellow-flyers and flight patterns, regardless of the size of glider being flown.
4. The operation of any form of model glider is prohibited on University property in all area(s) other than that designated for such use.
5. Use of the designated area shall be on a first-come, first-serve basis, except when exclusive use has been reserved through the University's Events & Facilities Committee (EFC) process.
6. No model glider with a weight greater than two (2) pounds may be operated on University property.
7. All persons operating a model glider on University property must have a frequency flag affixed to their transmitter antenna, as well as a similar flag affixed to their frequency control device (flag colors must match). Additionally, the operator's name and frequency must be printed on the flag affixed to the frequency control device.
8. Operators are to control model gliders from the designated flight-line in accordance with designated flight patterns. (The flight pattern is posted at the field.)
9. Transmitters should only be operated while you are flying. Double-check transmitters being utilized by other operators to make sure no one is flying on the same frequency.
