

Community Engagement and Social Justice Faculty Fellows Program

The Center for Community Engagement (CCE) is now accepting applications for the **Community Engagement & Social Justice Faculty Fellows Program (CE&SJ)**. The Fellows Program is a development opportunity designed for faculty who seek to deepen their service-learning teaching and practice by expanding their thinking about social justice and, at the same time, create or refine a course that will allow students to engage with community issues through a social justice orientation (i.e. examining systems of power, privilege and oppression, questioning biases and assumptions, and working to dismantle the tools that perpetuate social and economic oppression and entrenched racial hierarchies), so they begin to see themselves as social change leaders and community advocates.

The CE&SJ Faculty Fellows Program is designed as a learning community in which new and experienced community-engagement practitioners work together to build individual and collective knowledge and campus capacity for high-impact community-engaged learning. The topics will be organized around a series of interactive workshops and investigation of current research and best practices for community-engaged and social justice pedagogy.

Topics will include:

- Distinguishing Traditional service-learning vs. Critical service-learning
- Understanding ways to prepare and develop a social justice orientation for students
- Critical service-learning: A practical application
- Planning, Designing, and implementing critical service-learning projects
- Creating classroom environments for critical conversations
- Introduction to working with community partners
- Introduction to Center for Community Engagement resources

Through this program, we hope to shape campus and community culture, to further develop students as agents of change, and to engage students in critical consciousness while actively processing issues of equity and justice in the community.

CE&SJ Faculty Fellow Expectations

- Attend monthly 2-hour workshops (October-May) offered over the course of the academic year. The first workshop will be 2.5 hours.
- Propose a new service-learning course or revise an existing service-learning course integrating best practices across the range of course components (planning, partnering, reflection, etc.) to be offered in the following academic year
- Submit a syllabus to the CCE integrating critical service-learning

- Complete the Community Engaged Learning Survey to your course receives a service-learning designation at the schedule level
- Attend the annual Celebration of Service
- Attend and present a poster of your course design at the Celebration of Service

CE&SJ Faculty Fellow Must Complete One of the Following:

- Serve as a Community Engagement and Social Justice workshop presenter in the following year
- Apply to be a Service-Learning Faculty Mentor
- Lead a CE&SJ workshop for future Fellows
- Submit an article, for presentation or publication, on your community-engaged teaching

CE&SJ Faculty Fellows will receive:

- \$1500 faculty stipend at the completion of the program
- All workshop related books and materials
- A letter of program completion

Eligibility

Any faculty (Lecturer and Tenure-Track) who teaches undergraduate or graduate courses and commits to integrating service-learning, with a social justice orientation, into a future course are welcome to apply. Space is limited, please apply early.

Application Process

We ask interested faculty to complete the <u>online application</u> and upload a letter of support from your program chair. Applications are due by September 15, 2023. Applications will be reviewed by CCE leadership, faculty and Program Chair will be notified of participation.

NOTE: Proposals with particular relevance to Black Lives Matter, aniti-racist or social or racial justice themes are highly encouraged.
