The English Education Option gives English major an opportunity to gain the coursework and experience necessary to pursue a teaching credential in English at the secondary level. This program is designed to substitute for the state subject examination and includes a portfolio requirement in lieu of the examination. ***The 12 units of electives that are required for the English BA are incorporated into this option and there is no need for an additional 12 units.*** Annual consultation with the English Education faculty advisor in English is required for students in this option.
