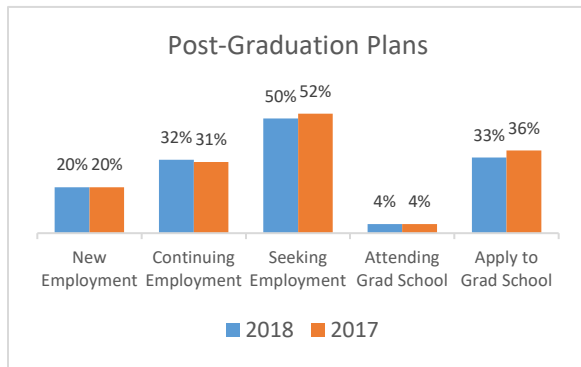


18% of 2018 CI Graduates have secured new employment related to their field, the same percentage as in 2017. 46% of graduates will be working or plan to work following graduation in Ventura County.

Survey Summary

- Survey administered to 1658 graduating students during the commencement registration, January 2020 - May 2020.

Post-Graduation Plans



- 20% of undergrads have secured new jobs by graduation, the same percentage as in 2017.
- Of those who have secured new employment, 70% are full-time and 92% reported that their job is related to their major. 68% of those continuing at their current job reported that their job is related to their major.
- Female grads, first generation grads, grads who received pell grants and grads from historically underrepresented groups were just as likely to secure jobs as their counterparts.
- Among majors with more than 10 grads, Nursing grads secured the highest levels of new employment (42%); along with Computer Science (36%), Political Science (33%), Math (32%), and Communication (28%).

Where will graduates work?

- The most common industries that CI grads will work or are looking for work, are Business (35%), Education (21%), Health Science (18%), Government (8%) and Arts (6%).

- 45% of graduates who got new jobs will be working in Ventura County. 68% of graduates remaining at their current job already work in Ventura County.
- 13% of graduates starting new jobs reported learning about their job through CSUCI in 2018, up 10% from 2017.

Graduate Students

- Those finishing with graduate degrees comprised 4% of respondents in 2018, down 2% from 2017. Graduate grads included students from MBA (52%), Educational Admin (33%), Biotech (10%), Education (5%), Math (7%) and Comp Science (7%) majors.
- 10% of graduate students have secured new jobs by graduation which is less than the undergraduate percentage (20%). Of the additional 68% of graduate grads who will be staying on at their current job, 59% are in a full-time position.
- 99% of graduate grads reported that they will be working at jobs or will be looking for jobs in California. Of those respondents, 55% are planning to stay in Ventura County.

Career Development Services

- 53% of graduates reported using Career Development Services (CDS) at least once at their time at CI, up 3% from 2017.
- Graduates who completed an internship have statistically higher rates of new employment (25%) than those who did not complete an internship (19%).
- Graduates who reported using CDS at least once were statistically more likely to have completed an internship while at CI (27% vs 16%). Further, graduates who reported using CDS at least once were statistically more likely to have found new employment (23%) than those graduates that did not (17%).
