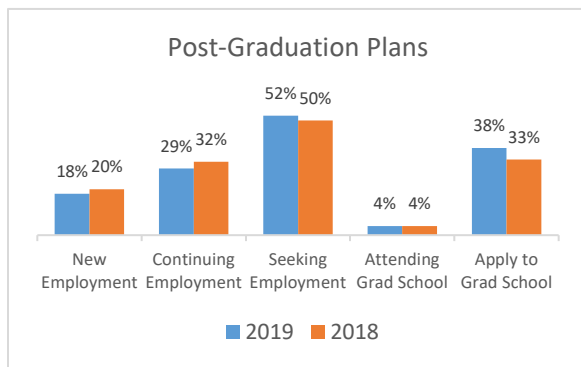


**17% of 2019 CI Graduates have secured new employment related to their field, a decrease of 1% from 2018. 44% of graduates will be working or plan to work following graduation in Ventura County.**

## Survey Summary

- Survey administered to 1891 graduating students during the commencement registration, January 2019 - May 2019.

## Post-Graduation Plans



- The percentage of graduates reporting having secured new employment has decreased 2% points from 2018.
- Of those who have secured new employment, 65% are full-time and 91% reported that their job is related to their major. 69% of those continuing at their current job reported that their job is related to their major.
- Female grads, first generation grads, and pell recipients were statistically less likely to secure jobs than their counterparts.
- Among majors with more than 10 grads, Nursing students secured the highest levels of new employment (44%); along with Business (31%), Comm (30%), IT (28%) and Art (26%).

## Where will graduates work?

- The most common industries that CI grads will work or are looking for work, are education (16%), business (15%), health science (14%), STEM (13%) and human services (12%).

- 47% of graduates who got new jobs will be working in Ventura County. 71% of graduates remaining at their current job already work in Ventura County.
- 17% of graduates starting new jobs reported learning about their job through CSUCI in 2019, up 4% from 2018.

## Graduate Students

- Those finishing with graduate degrees comprised 4% of respondents in 2019, the same percentage as in 2018. Graduate grads included students from Biotech (40%), Education (22%), Business (18%), Computer Science (13%), Math (6%) and Educational Administration (6%).
- 12% of graduate students secured new jobs by graduation, which is less than the undergraduate population (18%). Of the additional 50% of graduate grads who will be staying on at their current job, 79% are in a full-time position.
- 91% of graduating grads reported that they will be working at jobs or will be looking for jobs in California. Of those respondents, 45% are planning to stay in Ventura County.

## Career Development Services

- 49% of graduates reported using Career Development Services at least once at their time at CI, down 4% from 2018.
- Graduates who completed an internship were statistically more likely to secure new employment (24%) than those who did not complete an internship (17%).
- Graduates who reported using Career Development Services at least once were statistically more likely to have completed an internship while at CI (22% vs 16%). Graduates who reported using Career Development Services at least once were more likely to have found new employment (19%) than those graduates that did not (17%).
