(1) PROVIDE A DESCRIPTION OF THE ACTIVITY

This activity featured guest clinician Ed Roscetti and his assistant leading our students through multiple rhythm and percussion exercises. The activity was totally interactive, and students participated during the entire session. Eventually all the students ended up on stage performing an African based composition on hand drums and various percussion instruments.

(2) HOW DID THE ACTIVITY RELATE TO A COURSE(S) AND/OR LEARNING OBJECTIVES?

This activity related directly to my PAMU 332 (World Music) class because we had been learning about African and Latin American rhythms throughout our course. This activity gave the students a chance to directly participate and perform interesting rhythms from around the world. We also had some attendees from our other music classes at this event. Any musician, dancer, or actor can benefit from reinforcing their sense of rhythm and timing.

(3) WHAT DO YOU SEE AS THE STRENGTHS OF THE ACTIVITY?

The strength of this activity was the direct hands-on participation by our students. That got the students involved to a very high degree. Ed Roscetti also followed my instruction to keep the technical jargon simple for our many general education students. That way, everybody was able to follow along and not become mystified by musical notation terms.

(4) WHAT WOULD YOU SAY ARE/WERE THE ACTIVITY'S WEAKNESSES?

I saw no weaknesses in this activity. All the students were highly enthusiastic about this activity, and in fact, the students wished that we had more than 75 minutes for this workshop.

I think this activity is pretty solid as it is. Now that Ed is keeping the terminology simple and easy to understand, anybody can follow along. The only improvement would be if we somehow had more classroom time for this activity.

I learned from the student feedback (see below) that they really enjoyed and benefited from this interactive percussion workshop. It seems that this experience is one activity to keep bringing back to our course in the future.



9. How did this activity relate to the content and/or learning outcomes of the courses that you are taking?

Text Response

Learning about rhythms and how to play some drums and other instruments. very beneficial in knowing how to keep in rhythm and how all musicians come together.

In class we are learning about Latin music styles.

We learned different rhythmic patterns and how to play different instruments.
