A. ADDRESS THE FOLLOWING QUESTIONS:

(1) PROVIDE A DESCRIPTION OF THE ACTIVITY;

This activity funded an Early Childhood Studies (ECS) Seminar for California State University Channel Islands (CI) students and early childhood educators, infant/ toddler, preschool, and kindergarten-3rd teachers, and early childhood professionals in Ventura and Santa Barbara Counties. Attendees gained knowledge from a lecture provided by an international leading expert on Learning Stories. The seminar presentation topic was on Learning Stories which is New Zealand's national early childhood assessment practice. Learning Stories are a formative assessment in which teachers document children's learning and development through written narrative observations. This seminar lecture provided information for teachers on the socio cultural theoretical framework and application of the Learning Stories approach. On May 8th & 9th 2017, Wendy Lee, the renowned coauthor of Learning Stories and Director of New Zealand's (NZ) Educator Leadership Project, provided the seminar lecture on Learning Stories including, NZ bi cultural, bilingual national early childhood curriculum and the connection to the assessment practice, research on formative assessments, and international application of the Learning Stories method. Local early education programs and CI students benefited from hearing about the cutting edge Learning Stories approach which has impacted local, state, national, and international children's assessment practices.

(2) HOW DID THE ACTIVITY RELATE TO A COURSE(S) AND/OR LEARNING OBJECTIVES?

The ECS Learning Stories Seminar activity supported the learning objective for the following ECS courses:

- ECS 460- Infant/Toddler Educaring
- ECS 461- Infant/Toddler Student Teaching
- ECS 456- Family & Community Engagement
- ECS 470- Teaching and Learning Preschool/Primary
- ECS 471-Preschool/Primary Student Teaching
- ECS 462-Supporting Dual Language Learners
- ECS 463-Creating and Supporting Reciprocal Family Community Networks

The seminar helped increase ECS students understanding of the benefits of the Learning Stories formative child assessment approach. In addition, attendees learned how Learning Stories assessment method includes child, parent, family, and community voices. Students gained increased awareness of diverse, cultural and linguistic representation through Learning Stories, as a way to support children who are dual language learners. The seminar supported deeper understanding and increased knowledge for ECS students who develop learning stories as part of their CI student teaching course work with infants and toddlers, preschool, and school age children.

Description of Assessment Process

(3)WHAT DO YOU SEE AS THE STRENGTHS OF THE ACTIVITY?

The strength of the activity was the powerful, transformative presentation by Wendy Lee. Ms. Lee presentation helped students understand NZ historical move away from deficit based assessment practices to the Learning Stories narrative formative assessment approach. Over 200 people attended the seminar. Due to the size of the facility, the event in Ventura County was limited to 200 attendees. Students and the early childhood community was inspired by the seminar presentations and gained new knowledge to implement the Learning Stories approach in early childhood settings throughout Ventura and Santa Barbara Counties.

Another strength of the activity was the collaboration that occurred between CI and multiple Ventura County community partners: Ventura County Office of Education (VCOE), Child Development Resources (CDR), Child Development Incorporated (CDI), Resource and Referral (R & R), and Family Childcare Home Education Network (FCHEN). CDR provided the facility at no cost and Spanish translation equipment. VCOE paid for IT services, part of the food costs, and provided staff for the registration, sign in and evaluation of the seminar. Prior to the seminar, collaborative planning occurred monthly with all partners for six months.

Due to the high interest in Learning Stories seminar in Ventura County, a second seminar was provided by Wendy Lee in Santa Barbara at the County Office of Education (SBCOE), Pacific Coast Association for the Education of Young Children (PCAIEYC) and University California Santa Barbara (UCSB) Early Childhood Care & Education Services and First Five. In partnership and collaboration with CI, students from CI Goleta Campus and the Santa Barbara early childhood community, attended a second seminar by Wendy Lee.

In addition, several students from both CI main campus and the Goleta campus, presented their course work using Learning Stories as part of the presentations. Also, in collaboration with VCOE and UCSB, student from both campuses and community member from Ventura County and Santa Barbara presented Learning Stories posters, sample Learning Stories, children's portfolios, "My Story" booklets made during fall 2016 IRA funded trip to Santa Rosa Island, and Learning Stories from CI service learning STEM events. A huge success of this seminar was because of all the planning and collaboration with so many dedicated Ventura and Santa Barbara County early childhood community partners.

The positive feedback from the students and early childhood community was great. Evaluations were distributed to elicit feedback. Here are some comments from the evaluations:

“Teachers will always be learning.”

“Learning Stories are a tool for change.”

“Learning Stories capture the smallest moments of the children but, they can have a huge impact on the children and families.”

“One idea I will take away from this seminar is the power of documentation with the [learning stories] examples and hearing voices from those in the [Ventura] county using the learning stories”

“Learning Stories approach is a ‘breakthrough’ from traditional assessments.”

“What it means to be a learner is valued, as well as, knowledge and skills.”

“Learning Stories connects you to the child and their family. It strengthened my view of observation and assessment. It creates something personal that will withstand the test of time.”

“As a CSUCI student who has previously done Learning Stories in my classes, it was great to hear Wendy Lee [coauthor of Learning Stories text used in ECS courses]. My next steps include applying Learning Stories at my work place.”

(3) WHAT WOULD YOU SAY ARE/WERE THE ACTIVITY’S WEAKNESSES?

The seminar was only three hours. A half an hour was dedicated to several CI student and community members presenting their work with Learning Stories. Feedback received from the evaluations indicated attendees thought the the seminar was too full. It was clear that more time was needed for the seminar speaker to be able to answer questions and for the CI students and community members to be able to present their Learning Stories. As a result of the feedback from the evaluations and student responses, plans are being considered for a full day Learning Stories conference spring 2018, at VCOE with Wendy Lee, as the Key Note speaker.

Another weaknesses of the seminar was the process at CI to pay the international speaker. The amount of forms required, process, time and energy was extensive. For example, the international seminar speaker had to meet with a lawyer in New Zealand, contact the consulate, get notarization (only four notaries in the NZ region), apply for ITIN number with the IRS, all of which took time and had additional costs which the speaker incurred.

(4) HOW WOULD YOU IMPROVE THIS ACTIVITY FOR NEXT TIME?

Next time, I would like to have a simpler process for the seminar speaker to get paid and on a timelier basis.

Also, I would extend the seminar speaker to a full day conference. A full day conference would allow for Wendy Lee to be the keynote speaker and have breakout sessions where CI students could present their research on Learning Stories, including Spanish speaking sessions, session for family child care providers, session for educators new to Learning Stories, advanced session for teachers who may be more experienced with using Learning Stories, CI ECS faculty to present on how to design assessment and curriculum undergraduate courses using Learning Stories as an authentic assessment approach in conjunction with California child assessment tool, referred to as, the Desired Results Developmental Profile (DRDP), and a have a closing session with a panel of educators from Ventura and Santa Barbara County who implement Learning Stories.

(5) WHAT DID YOU LEARN FROM THE PROCESS?

I learned how much work it takes to plan a seminar with multiple community partners! It takes a lot of time, communication, and commitment to work with so many different organizations. However, the impact was so powerful and well received, I am glad that the seminar was not solely hosted by CI. Instead, this activity strengthened community partnerships and engagement with early childhood educators across Ventura and Santa Barbara Counties.
