(1) PROVIDE A DESCRIPTION OF THE ACTIVITY

This series of FIVE concerts brought in many professional musicians who specialize in the performance of ethnic music. Our guest artists demonstrated African, Irish, Flamenco, and Hindustani Indian music to our students. In addition, we had a hands-on interactive percussion clinic, where students got to play a variety of ethnic percussion instruments while they learned traditional African and Cuban rhythm patterns.

(2) HOW DID THE ACTIVITY RELATE TO A COURSE(S) AND/OR LEARNING OBJECTIVES?

My PAMU 332 World Music class has been learning about various types of music from around the world. These in-class performances gave the students a much deeper appreciation for the music of each culture that was presented. In addition to performing the music, our guest artists spoke about the cultural importance of the music (and dance) that they were presenting. My students were also assigned writing projects about these concerts, which further address our course's learning objectives and our Writing Across the Curriculum mission.

(3) WHAT DO YOU SEE AS THE STRENGTHS OF THE ACTIVITY?

The strengths of these activities were the fantastic opportunities for our students to witness a variety of multicultural ethnic music being performed up close and personal. The attached student feedback demonstrates that the students gained a much better understanding and appreciation for music of other cultures when they witness these live performances and hear the informative commentaries from our expert musical guests.



Being able to see the theory practiced firsthand was really helpful.

It relates with the lectures and readings for my class.

This activity fit perfectly with the course material on native African music. It also demonstrated the many diverse cultural and musical backgrounds that performers can come from and still find common interest/passion in African music. Because of this, many of the songs not only included traditional African rhythms but also had elements of jazz and other complex harmonies on top of that.

In my opinion it gave the students in the class and live and personal experience with African music and the life stories of the members of the band.

Showcasing music of many genres

The band played various styles of jazz, including Latin Jazz.

The musicians informed us of the counts such as a 12/8. Each one of them told us about their instruments and their background from where they came from and the type of music they played back in their hometown. They explained their experiences and the styles of music they used to play and what felt more of their vibe. It related directly because we got to experience a piece of the African culture, first hand. It was also beautiful to hear about every one of the bands backgrounds and how that influences their musical styles.

It's always helpful to see music in person to truly appreciate it.

This concert represented the musical forms and harmonies that we have been learning about in class. It also introduced different percussion, string, and brass instruments and combined these individual sounds to compose a group of Caribbean/African jazz music. This was a great example of a visual aid in addition to Native Vibe videos on Youtube. This concert was also a nice celebratory way to acknowledge Black History Month because of how far we've come in integrating diversity in a musical aspect but in a social aspect as well.

It related to the content because the band performed jazz style in their music such as soloist improvisation.

You get to learn how people get into these styles of music, along with learning about the styles of music that are different from America's standards and enjoy the different styles and culture of music that wouldn't be possible without small concerts like this.

The Native Vibe band consist of members that come from different parts of the world introducing music where they come from so it ties in to the World Music course in terms of getting a visual of a band from a different country with a different musical style.

Before the event, in my course, we went over the different African music styles and its history. This event helped to further my learning by understanding it in a live setting.

The music in the concert was African/Jazz fusion, we are currently studying about African music.

Being able to watch the band Native Vibe perform for our class and any other students and/or faculty that wanted to attend was eye opening to the topic of West African music. It showed us that modern bands still incorporate West African styles and rhythms in order to keep the culture alive. We can read about it in the textbook but being able to actually see it with our own eyes makes it more real, we get to experience the beauty and culture that we have only read about which in turn helps us better grasp the concept of the culture.

Learning about African music and culture as well as Jazz in America. It provide me with a more specific example of each type of music.

We were learning about the various African instruments and also about African music.

Practicing auditory acuity, comparison of musical styles and possible influences

This activity was in relation to the content/learning outcomes of my World Music course because it was a great example of an amazing group, who plays African-Jazz style of music. We have just went over African music in the course and it was awesome to see the performance live instead of from a youtube video.



This related to the material we are going over in in my PAMU 332 class that I am taking since we are talking about different dances from different cultures.

I've taken world music before and really enjoyed the class which prompted me to take the Beatles class that I am currently in. I think music is a universal language and regardless of what type of music genre I may be studying that there's always a correlation between them.

We have been learning about Flamenco music in class.

We are learning of traditional music from all regions of the world, and the various cultural influences of the music as well as characteristics of the musical style. 



Please have more concerts!


