Brief Activity Description	The Performing Arts annual stage production will be held in the fall of 2016, instead of the spring semester, in conjunction with PA391 Production which is cross-listed with ART 391. This is a PA core-course required of all PAmajors, offered as an elective for Art majors, and open to all CI students. PA391 is a vital component of the learning experience for all PAmajors and minors. It addresses the PA program learning outcomes, providing students with an opportunity to collaborate with peers from a diverse range of artistic and cultural backgrounds to produce a live stage performance. Although it is required only for PAmajors, enrollments from students in other majors is usually high.  Student participation includes performing on stage before a live audience, designing scenic elements for the show, assisting the director and stamanager, researching the performance/production history, coordinating stage costuming and accessories, running the front of house, and writing programs and publicity. Students work on the technical preparation, rehearsal, and performance of a stage play that culminates in public presentations for CI students, faculty, staff and the general community.  The learning objectives of PA391 place students at the center of the learning experience; they include the development of expertise and practica experience in production, the evaluation and reflection (in writing) on the creative process, and the application of multiple aspects of performance production. These goals are accomplished through the collaborative process of preparation and performances central to all performing arts. The project will feature the work of CI students through their designs, performances, and other production work vital to the show's success. Capstone students from the Art program will be invited to design and produce publicity materials and programs; PAmajors, minors and other CI students we act on stage, assist backstage, run lights and sound during the show, help make costumes and props, as well as supervise seat
Learning Outcomes and Relation to IRA to Course Offerings	PA/ART 391 Production: the class both cast and crew must enroll in.  ART 499 Art Capstone Project: students enrolled in Capstone may contribute as designers or videographers.  ENGL/PATH 410 Shakespeare's Plays: students will be invited to attend a rehearsal and a performance and participate in a talk-back with the cast and director. Other Sources of Funding	The PA program will cover meals for the cast and crew during long technical rehearsals and the post-show strike, as well as copier chargebacks and office supply needs. An additional source of income for this production will be ticket sales, usually \$1000 at least.
