Brief Activity Description

This event will feature Dr. Juan F. Carrillo, assistant professor of education at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill and founder and director of the Latin@ Education Research Hub (LERH), a national interdisciplinary research group focusing on addressing Latinx education issues. Dr. Carrillo will deliver a campus wide guest lecture on his recently published book,

Barrio Nerds: Latino Males, Schooling, and the Beautiful Struggle, which focuses on the schooling trajectories of working class Latino males that complicate narratives of achievement, success, and failure. Aside from the campus wide guest lecture, Dr. Carrillo will also meet with students, faculty, and staff involved in the newly formed Latino Male Initiative Working Group to discuss current dilemmas and possibilities for Latino males in K-16 education. The guest lecture will support the efforts of the Latino Male Initiative Working Group in starting a campus-wide conversation to support efforts for the recruitment, retention, and graduation of Latino male students. The Latino Male Initiative Working Group, a collaborative effort led by faculty staff from multiple departments and programs at CI, including the School of Education, Chicana/o Studies, Sociology and the Multicultural Dream Center, seeks to address the national trend of the “vanishing Latino male in higher education” (Saenz and Ponjuan, 2009) in Ventura County.
