Brief Activity Description	Since AY 2008 the Student Research Steering Council (SRSC) has worked with faculty to support students' participation in academic conferences For AY15-16, the SRSC was allotted \$10,000 in Lottery monies to fund student travel to research conferences, up to \$700 per student. This year, the SRSC is replaced by the Student Research Advisory Committee, which now takes on the responsibility of locating funds for this mission-driven, student-centered activity.		
	The benefits to students of attending conferences are multiple. Students		
	(a) Gain experience presenting their work. (b) Network with members of their professional communities.		
	(c) Learn from peers who are conducting similar research. (d) Increase awareness of professional opportunities available in their fields.		
	These experiences increase the competitiveness of our students at the next stage of their careers and give students valuable information for determining what that next step should be.		
	Over 100 CI students attended the one-day Southern California Conference on Undergraduate Research (SCCUR) at Harvey Mudd College. SRS Student Travel Funds paid registration fees for these 100+ students and covered bus transportation costs for three buses, the total being about \$9,000.00. The CI students presented over 60 posters (manywith multiple presenters) and gave 17 oral presentations, in a variety of disciplines. Dozens of others are presenting at conferences in the Fall and Spring using IRA funding.		
	Funding from IRA also supports travel related to the CSU Student Research Competition, and other student research-related travel.		
Learning Outcomes and Relation to IRA to Course Offerings	The SRSC received requests totaling more than \$50,000 for CI students to present their research at academic conferences between October 201 and June 2016. Requests were made on behalf of students majoring in Anthropology, Biology, Chemistry, Computer Science, English, Liberal Studies, Mathematics (undergraduate and MS), Political Science, and Psychology. Our activities benefit all students, programs, and many courses campus.		
	The University specifies that, "CSUCI graduates will possess an education of sufficient breadth and depth to appreciate and interpret the natural, social and aesthetic worlds and to address the highly complex issues facing societies. Graduates will be able to:  Identify and describe the modern world and issues facing societies from multiple perspectives including those within and across disciplines, cultures and nations (when appropriate).  Analyze issues, and develop and conveyto others solutions to problems using the methodologies, tools and techniques of an academic discipline.

Other Sources of Funding	As of this writing, we do not have any guaranteed source of funding for our activities. We lobby the Provost's Office for permanent support for our activities and we have a proposal pending for Lottery Funds. It is important to emphasize that we do not consider IRA to be our only source of funding for student research activities. Last year IRA funds accounted for about a third of our resources to support students. We hope, one day, that our mission-centered, student-centered activities will be fully funded through state funds and we will not have to return to the IRA Committee for generous funding. As a Committee we are committed to that vision.
Target Audience/Student Marketing	Student Research is in many ways a conversation between a student and a faculty member. Thus, most Student Research Travel opportunities are the result of this conversation and/or collaboration between students and faculty. Although some calls for research competitions are open to the full student body, most are funneled through faculty. Which means that faculty are responsible for marketing both student research opportunities as well as travel associated with this research.
Bring Benefit to Campus	Students regularly present their research on campus. One example is the SAGE Forum. Our support for student travel stipulates that students who receive funding will present at SAGE.
Sustainability	Our travel policies (see above) require that student travel minimizes the environmental impact of student travel through carpooling, ride sharing, and the use of buses.
