- 2. Brief Activity Description

Describe the activity and its relationships to the educational objectives of the students' program or major

Brief Activity Description

Santa Rosa Island (SRI) provides an invaluable living laboratory for Ecosystem Restoration (ESRM 352) students. The island has a long history of intensive grazing and non-native species introductions causing large scale degradation. Since the Channel Islands National Park was established, non-native species removal and recovery efforts have led to restoration of over 42 km2 of woodland, chaparral, and scrub vegetation.

On Friday afternoon, students will hike to areas near Carrington Point to evaluate the effectiveness of ecosystem restoration in native grassland, shrub, and maritime chaparral ecosystems. Student will visit representative sample locations established as part of the Channel Island National Park long term inventory and monitoring program. They will learn how to conduct point intercept vegetation samples, compare existing conditions with long term data extending back to 1990, and evaluate ecosystem restoration success as indicated by vegetation change.

On Saturday, students will tour the island oak restoration site on Soledad Ridge. The island oak is an endemic species that depends on coastal fog for moisture, and the highland ridges that are habitat for this species are severely eroded. Students will visit the restoration site and learn about the check dams, wattles, fog capture screens, and leaf litter traps placed to build soil resources and enable reforestation. Students will also learn about the soil profile diagrams established by past capstone students to monitor soil and vegetative development. Time allowing, students will also help park staff build and maintain some sample erosion control structures.

These activities will be supported by studying satellite imagery, historic air photos, and data generated by Channel Islands National Park and past capstone projects focused on ecosystem restoration at SRI.

Learning Outcomes and Relation of IRA to Course Offerings

1. ESRM 352 (Ecosystem Restoration)

2. Many of the principles and practices of ecosystem restoration are best learned by seeing and doing. Field trips are an essential part of learning in an applied resource management class such as ecosystem restoration. Large scale restoration projects are rare, and the opportunity to reduce human influence and remove invasive species to the degree that has occurred on Santa Rosa Island (SRI) is rarer still. This field trip is an invaluable opportunity for students to see the course principles in action, ie. how to rebuild degraded ecosystems and manage succession. Specifically, the SRI field trip will illustrate the following course modules: managing energy inputs, regulating ecosystem processes, managing soil and water resources, wildlife management, and vegetation management.

Description of Assessment Process

As part of the ESRM 352, students are required to perform a site assessment or evaluation of restoration success and submit it as a report that is graded as a semester project. Such reports are standard documents produced by professionals in the field, and this activity helps students learn a core skill and hone their analytical and writing skills. Students that participate will submit an evaluation of restoration success on the work done on Santa Rosa Island.

What is your intended audience and how do you intend to market this to your students?

The intended audience includes the undergraduate students enrolled in ESRM 352 (Ecosystem Restoration). Student enrollment is typically from ESRM, BIO, and ANTHRO. A field trip to Santa Rosa Island provides students with an immersive opportunity to learn about a unique ecosystem restoration project, and to view first hand broader conservation biology and cultural resource management issues.

If this is an event that is off campus, how do you plan to bring back the benefit of this event to campus?

The Channel Islands are part of the "cultural landscape" of the Southern California coastal zone, and are integral to the place identity of the student body. Providing students opportunities to visit the islands and form a sense of place not only enhances the students' educational experience, but helps deepen the cultural experience of the broader student body as they return and share their experiences.

Sustainability

This project focuses on "environmental education", one of the five areas of sustainability identified by the Channel Islands Sustainability Task Force. Through this trip, students will learn about the human influence on the landscape and what can be done to sustainably manage and ultimately restore natural resources. Students will observe sustainability practices that include legal protection as a National Park and Marine Sanctuary, invasive species removal, endangered species recovery, erosion control, and reforestation.
