1. Brief Project Description.

The Art Program is seeking MSFT funds to purchase new furniture that will help provide an improved classroom experience and a communal studio environment for Topanga Hall.

Located near the eastern edge of the campus, Topanga Hall was one of the first buildings to open in Cl's earliest days. While it has been exciting to see new facilities across the campus continue to develop and evolve, Topanga has remained virtually unchanged for 15 years. Fortunately, two of the building's

classrooms (1976 and 1978) have been slated for a major refresh that will include new carpeting, new blinds, updated projection equipment, new paint and added sound insulation. The funding for the refresh is already in place, and these upgrades will help to once again bring this facility up to the level of other high-quality classrooms located across the campus.

Alongside these important renovations, the Program seeks to upgrade the outdated furniture in Room 1976, much of which is in a state of disrepair. Between 100 and 125 GE and foundation-level students use this classroom each semester. We are looking to replace the wobbly, run-down drafting desks with large studio worktables, similar to those being used for foundation classes held in Napa Hall. Not only will new furniture provide a boost in morale and enhanced aesthetics, the upgrade to communal worktables will allow students to sit around the perimeter and face one another as they work. These tables provide an ideal environment for improved interactions, where not only can students discuss projects, they can see each other while they are working - they can compare techniques, spread out materials, and experiment with media, formatting, and scale. Working in this capacity is a hallmark of artistic practice, and our goal is to provide students with an experience that closely matches a professional studio environment. Along with the antiquated desks, we are seeking to replace the classroom stools. After 15 years of continuous use, these stools are bent and twisted out of shape, the arms are crumbling, and the fabric is worn through. Together, these desks and chairs have served us well, and they have been repaired numerous times by our technicians. With the renovation of this space, now is time to make these important classroom upgrades that will enhance students' artistic output, create a positive and professional setting, and maximize the capabilities of this space.

Projected costs are included below. As with most campus furniture, seating is provided by BKM, and the identicai"Node" stools are already in use in other campus classrooms, including lab spaces in Aliso Hall. BKM does not offer a suitable "industrial-style" worktable for a studio environment, and in the past, we have used Global Industrial for purchasing large worktables. Because these are tables intended for a more "rustic" studio environment, they are likely to be less costly than desks or comparable laboratory tables sourced from BKM. With the heavy-duty laminate plastic top, these tables are the most rugged and cost-effective option for the space, and each table can accommodate four students.

For the students and faculty who frequent this classroom, this furniture will help to provide a professional environment that is conducive to creativity and collaboration. We visualize the space will

become a popular workroom for students to plan and lay out projects. Many of the students enrolled in these foundation courses are freshmen, and this revamped classroom will improve their first impressions of the university. The effectiveness of these upgrades will also be gauged by the high quality work that is produced in the classroom. Whereas now this space is, in many ways, "off the radar" at CI, we hope to highlight and exhibit student work in this new setting. Any opportunity to exhibit student work builds a sense of esteem and pride for those enrolled in Art courses, and students in a range of classes will have the opportunity to experience the work of their peers. We will readily acknowledge the support of MSFT funding by providing nicely designed signage in the room.
