The Basic Needs and Emergency Intervention program has utilized MSFT funds provided for the 2017/18 year. The Dolphin Pantry is primarily sustained through the generosity of donations by the CSUCI and local community as well as student volunteers. However, the program did utilize MSFT funding that went towards the infrastructure of the Pantry such as shelving and storage containers. This has allowed for easier access for students to see the amount of food and hygiene items available for use, while also increasing storage space to accept more donations from the community.

The Basic Needs and Emergency Intervention program stayed within its budget and only utilized \$4,764.04 of the original allocation. The program did not utilize MSFT funds for student assistant support or refrigeration and freezer equipment. CSUCI's Basic Needs Program Request for Proposal (RFP) that was granted from the Chancellor's Office, was used to purchase those materials.

The Dolphin Pantry continues to be a huge success with over 4,500 visits to the pantry during the 2017/18 academic year.
