- 1. The President's Planning Council has asked all University divisions to provide them with a brief presentation that addresses the following questions:
 - How does the division's strategic plan fit with and support the University's General Strategies;
 - What successes and/or changes in direction have occurred as they relate to the general strategies.
- 2. The Division of Student Affairs' Presentation Goals:
 - To briefly highlight the four-step process used by the division to develop its strategic plan for 2011-16;
 - To discuss those aspects of the plan that address the questions of alignment and support of the University's General Strategies;
 - To address any additional questions raised by Council members.
- 3. The Charge and Work of the Division of Student Affairs' Strategic Planning Committee:
 - To critically examine the division's existing strategic plan;
 - To reevaluate the division's mission and goals and their alignment with the University's Mission and Strategic Plan; and, finally,
 - To develop a strategic plan for 2011-16 that takes into account the strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and potential threats to the division's plans.
- 4. Strategic Planning Process—the Division of Student Affairs relied on four basic questions to guide its planning:
 - Who are we as a division within the CI campus community?
 - Where are we as a division in terms of our contributions to the CI campus community?
 - Where do we want to be as a division in the next five years?
 - How do we plan to get where we want to be over the next five years?
- Strategic Planning Committee's Assessment of the Division of Student Affairs' Alignment with the University's Mission and Key Strategic Planning Elements
 - Evidence is presented to show that a high degree of alignment exists between the University's Mission/General Strategies and the Division of Student Affairs' mission and goals;
 - Evidence is also presented to show that direct links exist between the University's Mission/General Strategies and the work that is done through the Division of Student Affairs' programs.
- 6. Division of Student Affairs Strategic Planning Committee's Assessment of Student Affairs Strategic Plan's Support of the University's General Strategies and Initiatives.
 - Presenters are able to point to staff training in Program Planning, Implementation, Assessment, and
 Quality Improvements as a tool used to ensure that program outcomes support the University's Mission,
 General Strategies, and Initiatives;
 - Evidence is presented to show that a high degree of common ground exists between the Division of Student Affairs and other members of the campus community; that shared mission and goals can be the basis of effective co-curricular programs that support the University's Mission and General Strategies.
