- 5) Event Update
 - a. Bike Patrol
 - i. Started at beginning of fall 2022 semester
 - ii. Thank you for follow-up comments from Theresa and Melea
 - iii. Remember to include faculty and staff relationships in planning, as well as students
 - iv. Overall community feedback has been positive
 1. Students have commented that it makes it more comfortable to approach officers on bike patrol
 - b. Pan Dulce with the Police 9/29/2022 and Coffee with the Cops – 10/22/2022
 - i. Questions were raised about who the Police on our campus serve
 1. We serve both campus and University Glen area as well as jurisdiction for 1-mile perimeter around campus
 - ii. Why are we doing Pan Dulce on campus and Coffee in University Glen
 1. In celebration of Latinx Heritage Month (September) we had pan dulce
 2. Event in University Glen is in October

- iii. With the new development in University Glen, how is patrol time and effort paid for?
 - 1. There will be 1500 people, including a 55 and over housing area, that will increase calls for service
 - a. Site Authority will help with funding for additional officers
 - iv. Is there an area for the public to view police reports for the campus and University Glen?
 - 1. Citizen RIMS is a public facing platform where all calls are posted

 - c. #PinkPatchProject
 - i. October is breast cancer awareness month
 - 1. Officers wear pink patches to stimulate conversations about early detection
 - 2. Pink patches and t-shirts are for sale to raise money to establish a scholarship for students who have had or have been impacted by cancer

- 6) Assembly bill 481 – Regulated Equipment
- a. Went over regulations associated with bill – we have 2 items on the list
 - i. Command center
 - 1. Used for emergencies and commencement
 - ii. Bean bag rounds
 - 1. Used for Critical Response Unit related activities and as less lethal force options in our patrol bags
 - b. All CSU police chiefs had to put together lists and they were approved by the Board of Trustees in July 2022
 - c. One of the regulations requires posting the policy on our website, sharing how we've acquired and used the items and holding a public meeting within 30 days of posting
 - d. What is the best way to facilitate/publicize meetings?
 - i. Hybrid meeting – one or two of these
 - ii. Use Padlet to collect comments during/after the meeting
 - iii. Library is a good common space between campus and the UG community
 - iv. What is the intent of the meeting?
 - 1. Required by law
 - 2. Transparency
 - v. TLI has set up that could be used
 - vi. Sage Hall
 - vii. Grand Salon or Aliso Hall

- viii. We should build in more time for other questions/topics that will come up or do a specialized forum for the community to bring their comments or concerns about the police department
