 - ii. Transparency and accountability for UPD
 - iii. Actively seek advice of diverse council
 - iv. Act as bridge to others on campus
 - v. Providing advice and input on issues
 - vi. Required to meet twice a semester an hour
- 6) CERT introduction and advertising feedback
 - a. Comm Emergency Response Team CERT
 - i. VCF trains
 - ii. 24 hours broken into 8 sessions
 - iii. First aid/CPR
 - iv. basic understanding ICS structure
 - v. teaches you to take care of yourself so you can take care of others



- b. If we have enough people, we can get training on campus, if not at Camarillo Airport
- c. UPD and EM did community presentation at TC regarding evacuations, CERT and being a fire-wise community
 - i. Looking for efficient ways to evacuate
 - 1. Propping up community to help

 - ii. Police department will get down to details
 - iii. Angela Portillo is the point of contact if administrators are harassing students
 - c. Student car was vandalized after protest
 - d. Understand police policy on protests/demonstrations/rallies/teach-ins
 - i. Police department doesn't want to disrupt first amendment rights
 - ii. There is time, place and manner policy by CSU that police department follows
 - iii. Protests on campus lately have been very peaceful
 - iv. Police department plans and prepares but if we are not needed, we won't be there low visibility
 - v. Police department is apolitical we keep the peace
 - vi. Police department talks regularly with President and cabinet
 - 1. First contact would be campus MPP, not police to try to resolve

- a. Safe parking project
 - i. Designated parking for students to sleep overnight
 - ii. Reduce financial strain for students
 - iii. Ther would be a time curfew for students
