
I was hired as a project archivist in 2000 (right out of graduate school-CSUN) to process the Robert J. Lagomarsino Collection (a local congressman), who donated one million dollars to establish the Robert J. Lagomarsino Department of Archives and Special Collections. Two years later, when CSU Northridge at CI became CSUCI, I was hired as the university archivist as well.

I arrange, preserve, describe, and make available (via our website and patron visitation) historical documents for the public. We collect documents, photos, and artifacts which celebrate Ventura County history and personalities.

The battle constantly rages in me between my historian self and my archivist self. "Do we really need those receipts?" I ask repeatedly.

I equate books to Wikipedia – both are fine to get you started on research, but it you really want the truth, go to the source – an archive. See me. (And, it's "funner".)
